IMPROVEMENTS BY P. & R.

Much More Spent for Betterments in 1918 Than Previous Year

Total income of the Philadelphia and Reading Railway Company for the year ended December 31, 1918, according to the annual pamphlet report of the company issued last night, amounted to \$16,570,754, compared with \$14,261,983 in the previous year. The surplus for the year was \$10,780,808, compared with \$15,600,000 in 1917.

Agnew T. Dice, president, in his report says:

"The Philadelphia and Reading Railway Company expended for additions and betterments to its property during the fiscal year ended December 31, 1918, \$6,892,008 (of which \$6,585,568 was charged to income), compared with \$3,800,337 during the previous fiscal year, an increase of \$3,082,161.

"The compensation to be paid by the United States railroad administration for the use of this company's railroad, as determined by the standard return for the test period, was fixed at \$15,808,331, and this amount was duly certified by the Interstate Commerce Commission."

BULLISH SENTIMENT DOMINATES CORN PIT

Broad Demand for All Futures From Commission Houses. Oats Strong

Chicago, June 12.—Bullish sentiment dominated in the corn market today, helped by additional disappointing crop reports, excessive moisture in the southwest and predictions of further unsettled weather. July touched the previous high price for the season, of \$1.72, made on May 5.

There was a broad demand for all futures from commission houses, and the market was stronger and more active than for some time.

Shipments of corn from Argentina for the week were estimated at 2,900,000 bushels, against 2,201,000 bushels last year. The demand for maize in the United Kingdom remained brisk.

Oats also were strong, in sympathy with corn. There was a good deal of buying for investment on unfavorable crop reports.

Omaha reported an excellent demand for the cash article. Good rains in portions of the northwest and Canada received but passing attention.

Shipments from Argentina for the week were estimated at 60,000 bushels, against 505,000 bushels last year.
