

ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE COMMENCEMENT WEEK

Eight to Receive B. A. Degree. Baccalaureate Sermon Tomorrow

Baccalaureate exercises in the Church of the Gesu, Eighteenth and Stiles streets, tomorrow evening, will begin the annual commencement celebration of St. Joseph's College. The solemn vespers will be attended by the entire student body and members of the senior class, wearing academic cap and gown. The Rev. Thomas M. Healy, of the class of 1905, will preach at the opening services. The exercises will close with solemn benediction of the most blessed sacrament.

On Thursday evening the alumni association will hold its annual banquet at the college. The absence of many graduates in the service of their country has interfered with the return of the association, but with the return of the interests of the college have been reawakened. A large attendance is expected at the banquet. The members of the senior class, who are to receive their diplomas on the following day, will on this occasion be inducted into the alumni association.

The annual commencement will take place in the college auditorium on Wednesday evening at 8:15 o'clock. Archbishop Dougherty will preside. Full students who have completed the college course will receive their diplomas in the church of the Gesu at 10 o'clock. Mr. Alfred J. Talley, chief assistant district attorney of New York city, will address the graduates. Mr. Talley is a graduate of St. Francis Xavier's College, New York, and has been honored by Fordham University with the degree of doctor of laws. He is prominent in all Catholic circles in his native city and is president of the Catholic Club of New York. During the troubles growing out of the state investigation of charitable institutions a year or two ago, Mr. Talley acted as counsel for Archbishop Farley and the Catholic institutions and won great praise for his skillful handling of the case. He has always been an enthusiastic advocate and a staunch defender of Catholic education and in the present educational crisis his address will undoubtedly be instructive and illuminating.

NEED MANY AIR FIELDS. Aero Club Places Number at 10,000 at Last Meeting Before Recess

Ten thousand air fields in the United States are not too many, according to what members of the Aero Club think and the manner in which they expressed themselves last night at the Engineers' Club. It was the last meeting before the summer recess. Reports were made of visits to the Aeronautics Congress held in Atlantic City during the month of May, in which the club had a prominent part. Announcements were also made as to the establishment of new local flying fields and aerial passenger services.

Several members who recently returned from Europe spoke of the many airplanes "aiming" between England and France. "You can go from Folkstone to Boulogne or from Dover to Calais in two hours instead of making a ten-minute voyage which might take two days," said Joseph A. Steiner, president of the club. "We have to have the courage to go through this period of seeming stagnation between the high activities and urge of war and the reversion to peace time conditions, with their awful dangers and uncertainty."

NEW SHIP LINE STARTED. Service to South American Ports Announced by Commerce Chamber

The establishment of a new steamship service from Philadelphia to South American ports has been announced by the Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce. The first vessel to sail will be the Neptun, a 7500-ton boat which was built at Hog Island and launched on Independence Day. This steamship has been allocated to this service by the United States Shipping Board. The Neptun will be on her berth at Pier 13, north of 13th street, on July 1. She will load for Buenos Aires and La Plata ports.

CONSUL THACKARA HOME. Government Representative at Paris Returns to Country on Leave

A. Montgomery Thackara, United States consul general at Paris since September, 1913, one of Philadelphia's most widely known diplomats, arrived in New York yesterday on the steamship Imperator. Mr. Thackara is on a two-months' furlough. He will visit his family, who, in recent years when not abroad, has been living in Washington. Mrs. Thackara before her marriage was Miss Eleanor Sherman, a daughter of General William Tecumseh Sherman, of Civil War fame. The consul general was born in this city in 1848, was educated in the public schools here, graduated from the Naval Academy at Annapolis in 1869, served in the navy until 1882, when he engaged in business in this city. In 1887 he was transferred to Havre, France, and from 1895 until he was transferred to Paris, he was consul general at Berlin.
