

RATIFY COVENANT, REPUBLICANS URGE

Abandon Partisanship in Peace Matters, Is Petition to C. O. P. Senators

28 LEADERS SIGN PLEA

New York, June 21.—Twenty-eight Republicans of national and even international prominence, all residents of New York, men whose word in other years has had great weight in the councils of the Republican party, have formally petitioned the Senate of the United States to abandon the partisan fight on the league of nations and ratify the peace treaty speedily and without amendment.

Drawn Up By Wickersham

The petition was drawn up by George W. Wickersham, former United States attorney general, nearly a month ago, when the dilatory tactics of certain elements of the Republican representation in Washington, which culminated in the Knox resolution, began to give those who have the welfare of the Republican party at heart serious concern.
