

'BE PATIENT,' URGES CARRANZA'S ENVOY

Says Trouble Will Be Settled if U. S. Believes in Mexico's "Good Faith"

NO CONFISCATION PLANNED

New York, July 3.—On the eve of sailing for France, General Cándido Aguilar, son-in-law and personal representative of President Carranza, declared last night that differences between the United States and Mexico would be settled amicably if the American people would trust in the "good faith" of the Mexican government.
He asked American people not to magnify and give undue credence to "every tale of violence that purports to come out of Mexico," and uphold their own official in Washington in their efforts to "smooth out difficulties."
"The Mexican Government," he said, "has no desire to confiscate property of mine owners. We are not so simple-minded or unreasonable as to suppose that any good could come from such a policy. We are rather looking toward a taxation system that will be fair and equal to all, whether they be Mexican or American."
"We feel that the great natural resources belong to the people, but we have no desire to and shall not dislodge the private owner so long as he works the resources. He is the legal owner."
"For the purposes of taxation the companies have been ordered to report to the government the number of wells they are drilling, and the companies do not want to do this."
"The true status of affairs has been made known to the State Department, and the facts can be given out only by that department or by the Mexican foreign office."
"A story printed this morning said that on May 16 troops were ordered to stop the drilling of wells on the property of certain companies. I know that no such order was ever issued."

Washington, July 3.—(By A. P.)—Copies of a Tampico newspaper describing the killing in the Mexican oil fields of John W. Correll, an American citizen, the attack on his wife and the severe wounding of his son, were received in Washington yesterday and were added to the material being accumulated by the State Department in its investigation of the outrage.
The story of the attack as printed in the Tampico newspaper does not designate the assailants as rebels and this was regarded as significant here, as had it been a rebel band that committed the outrage the Mexican censor, it was said, undoubtedly would have ordered that portion of the story emphasized.
Previous reports concerning the attack, which, it was learned was first reported to the State Department June 17, had brought out that the district in which the Corrells lived was in territory in the control of Carranza troops.

Washington, July 3.—(By A. P.)—Thirty members of the House of Representatives of the Mexican Congress, have petitioned President Carranza to retire General Pablo Gonzalez as head of the Mexican army, charging the general was using his position to further his candidacy for the presidency.
Advices from Mexico City yesterday said the petitioners declare that Gonzalez ought to be placed on the same footing as General Obregon, the other leading military candidate, who in a manifesto announcing his candidacy virtually disassociated himself from the army.
It is considered that the candidate who has control of the military forces will win the election.
General Gonzalez has published an answer, according to these advices, in which he takes issue with General Obregon's manifesto and makes the sugges-

tion by way of deprecation that a fresh revolution may be started as a result of the election.
Luis Cabrera, secretary of the treasury in the Carranza cabinet, has issued a statement predicting that it will be impossible to hold the election next July, and suggesting that Congress name Carranza's successor instead of holding an election.

BERLIN BANKERS FEAR REDS MAY GET VIENNA

Would Be "Only Too Glad" to Send Troops to Austria, Financier Says

Berlin, July 3.—(By A. P.)—Emit von Stauss, director of the Deutsch Bank and one of the German financial delegates at Versailles, said yesterday financial circles in Berlin feared that Vienna might shortly fall into the hands of the Bolsheviks, reports from there indicating that the city is politically in imminent danger in view of the activities of the Hungarian communists.
The Hungarian he said, were not only generously spending corruption funds but had perfected the overtaking of the Renner cabinet and the proclamation of a soviet republic.
Herr von Stauss indicated that Germany would be "only too glad" to send troops to the relief of the Danube capital, as it did in the case of Munich, but added that "there is a suspicion prevailing in official circles here that the Entente would promptly oppose such an expedition."

Vienna, July 3.—(By A. P.)—The money situation is troubling the Austrian public, as it is reported the government will take 50 per cent of the total amount of circulation. The floating currency for Austria alone is about 42,000,000,000 crowns, as compared with 2,000,000,000 for the whole empire before the war.
The communist government in Budapest, it is reported, is concentrating the metal coins of the old empire wherever they can be found and is offering rewards to those who denounce persons with hidden deposits of money.

DIFFER ON MOONEY STRIKE

Seattle Votes Against Walkout on July 4, While Tacoma Call Is Issued
Seattle, Wash., July 3.—(By A. P.)—The Seattle Central Labor Council announced today its members voted 76 to 67 against calling a general strike here July 4 in behalf of Thomas J. Mooney.
The Tacoma Central Labor Council today sent a request to all its affiliated councils for a general strike of all union labor here as a demonstration in favor of Mooney. The action was taken following a referendum vote of union workers. The strike call asks the workers to go out for five days, beginning July 4.

800 AT B. Y. P. U. RALLY

Delegates at St. Louis Discuss Home Missions and Reconstruction
St. Louis, July 3.—(By A. P.)—Home missions and reconstruction were among topics discussed at the twenty-eighth annual convention of the Baptist Young People's Union of America, which opened here today. More than 800 delegates are attending the convention which will continue through Sunday.

The morning session was taken up with conferences and a reception to the delegates. Speakers included Dr. J. W. Hoag, of Detroit, president, and F. Reynolds, of Toronto, vice president.

Roma, 2 luglio.—Considerevole eccitamento hanno qui causato i rapporti giunti da Fiume, pubblicati dai giornali di Roma, secondo i quali i soldati francesi, appartenenti alle forze interalliate, hanno traversato la città di Fiume gridando: "Viva la Jugoslavia, Viva la Francia, Morte all'Italia!"

I dispetti del giorno che la reazione causata da simile dimostrazione di grave tra la popolazione italiana e che serie conseguenze non si verificano si deve al pronto intervento dei carabinieri italiani.
Il Generale Graziani, comandante delle forze interalliate a Fiume, ha rapportato di aver fatto tenere la sua protesta al generale francese.
I giornali notano che le dichiarazioni di amicizia della Francia verso l'Italia, fatte in ufficiali occasioni dal Presidente Voltaire e da Clemenceau, sembrano una ironia, quando costantemente gli ufficiali francesi si mostrano ostili nei confronti della Francia e di tutti gli italiani nell'Adriatico, in Asia Minore ed in Africa.

Parigi, 1 luglio.—(Citradato)—L'Agence Radio ha trasmesso il seguente telegramma da Roma: "La stampa tedesca ha recentemente pubblicato la notizia che i nuovi delegati italiani avrebbero ripresentato la discussione riguardante l'alto Adige ed il Tirolo, in considerazione di una richiesta da parte del governo austriaco. La notizia è puramente fittizia. Le frontiere neutrali dell'Italia dalla parte dell'Austria sono state definitivamente aggiustate secondo i desideri italiani, come fu annunciato dal Ministro degli Esteri Tittoni nel suo ultimo discorso a Sedan. Questa questione è stabilita e qualsiasi rumore sulla medesima è evidentemente fantastico."

UKRAINIANS ROUTED BY POLISH DRIVE

Offensive Wins Lemberg-Halicz-Stanislaw Railway Line—Takes Enemy by Surprise

Paris, July 3.—(By A. P.)—The Polish forces on Saturday started a counter-offensive along the whole Galician-Volhynian front, according to advices from Warsaw.
The Poles say they have everywhere broken the Ukrainian resistance and that the Lemberg-Halicz-Stanislaw railway line is again in Polish hands.
The enemy suffered severe casualties, 2000 prisoners, thirty machine guns and huge stores being captured.
It seems that the Ukrainians were everywhere taken by surprise and they gave way at all points. The Poles occupied Brody.
