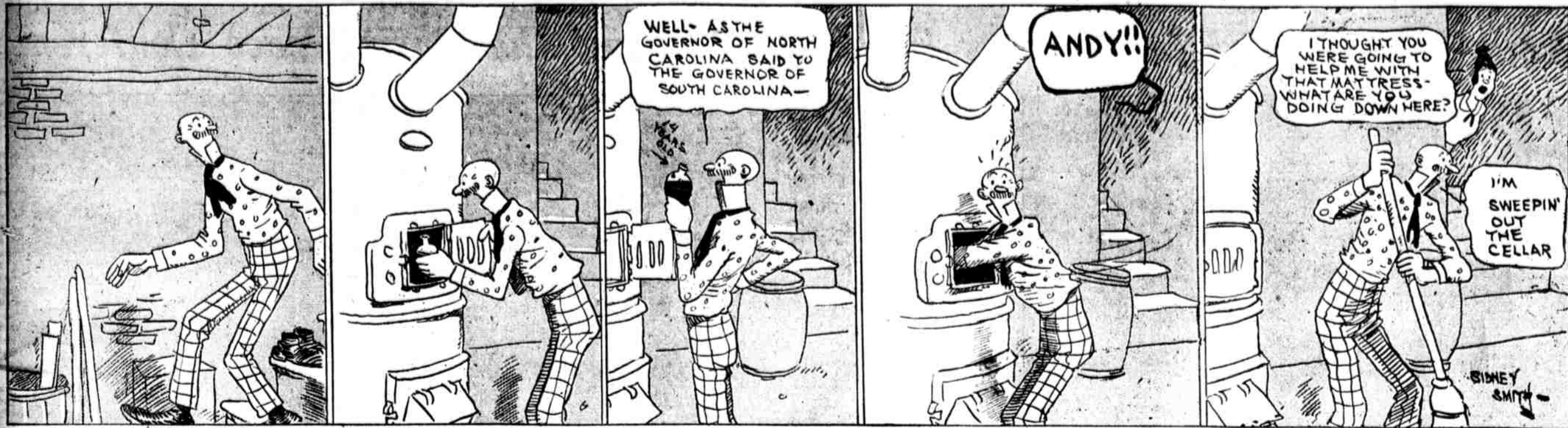

The Young Lady Across the Way



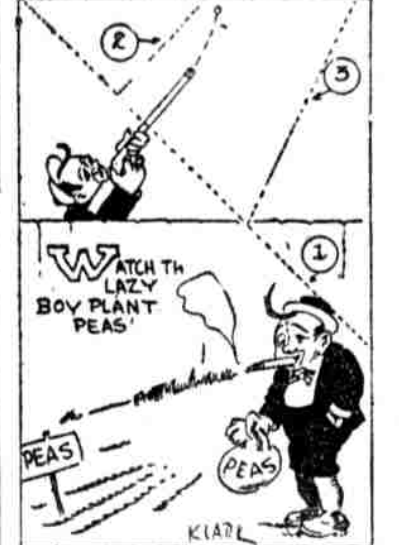
The young lady across the way says the pictures of the Prince of Wales impress her with the fact that he has got pretty high up in the world for so young a man.

MOVING PICTURE FUNNIES

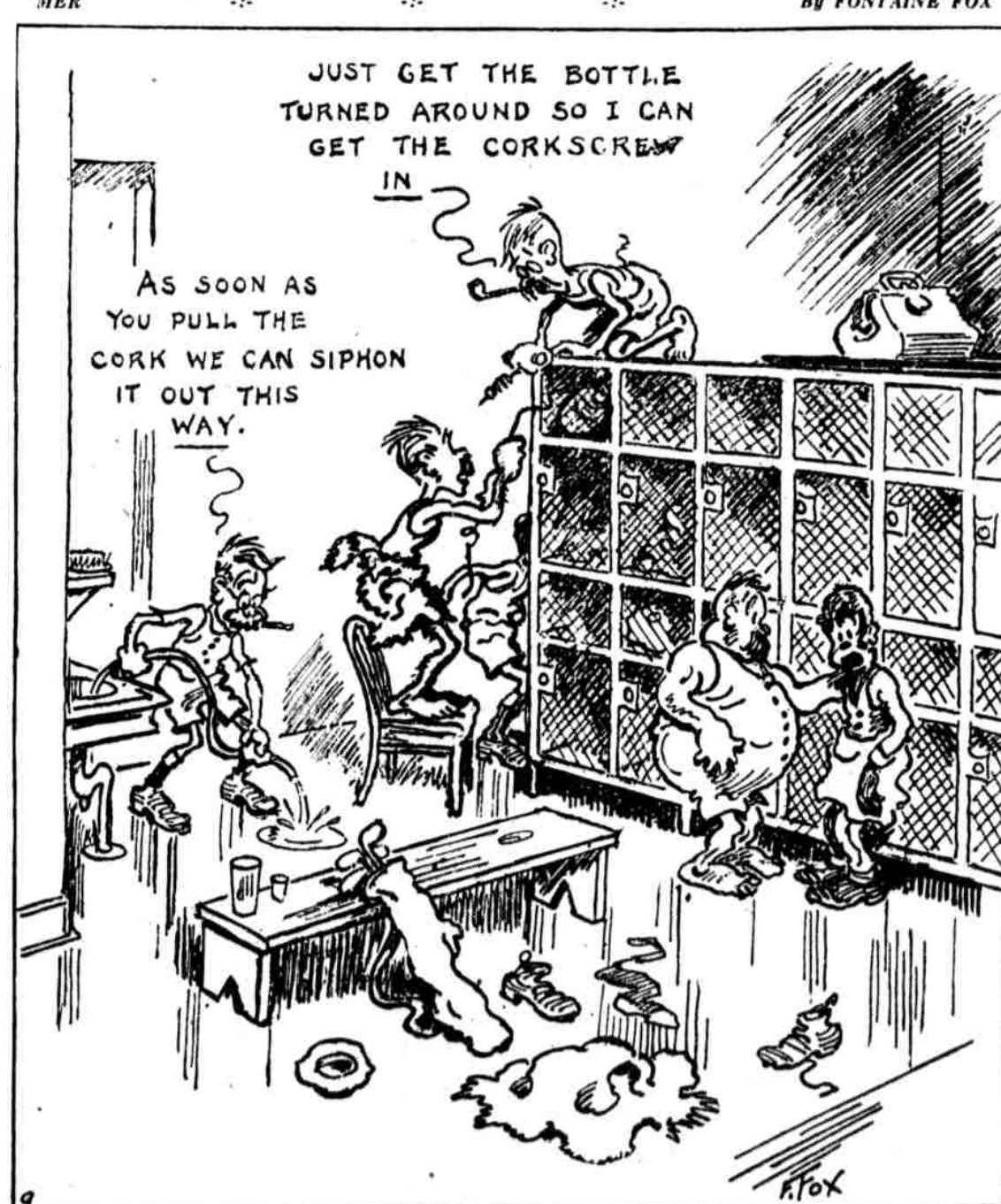
