Riverton, N. J., July 15.—H. S. Willoughby, of Aronimink, came through a winner in Class A in the annual class tournament held by the Riverton Golf Club.

There were four matches in Class A and Willoughby was the first to finish. The match was played over a heavy, soggy course, but the work of the contestants was excellent considering the conditions.

Class A players were late in starting. The Class C entries were the only ones to play this morning. J. R. Pierpont eliminated F. M. Borden by 1 up in a hard-fought match.

The match was between J. Wood Platt, North Hills, and Eddie Styles, Old York Road, and the Bala representatives, H. B. Hoffer and E. C. Clary.

The lowest full round of the day was made in the morning by Hoffer and Platt, each of whom had a 70.

Another good contest to be staged recently outside of the regular tournaments was played between J. Wood Platt, North Hills, and Eddie Styles, the merriment golfer of the Old York Road Country Club.

During the day's play, Platt had a bird and an eagle on the seventh and fourth holes. His play was exceptionally fine, as he finished with a 26, one above par, and coming in he did almost as well, completing the last nine holes in 39, a total of 75.

The most remarkable part of this match was the best ball played by Platt and Styles. The three birds made by Styles and the bird and eagle made by Platt gave them a best ball of 32 going out and 35 coming, a total of 67, one of the best records made in local golf this year.

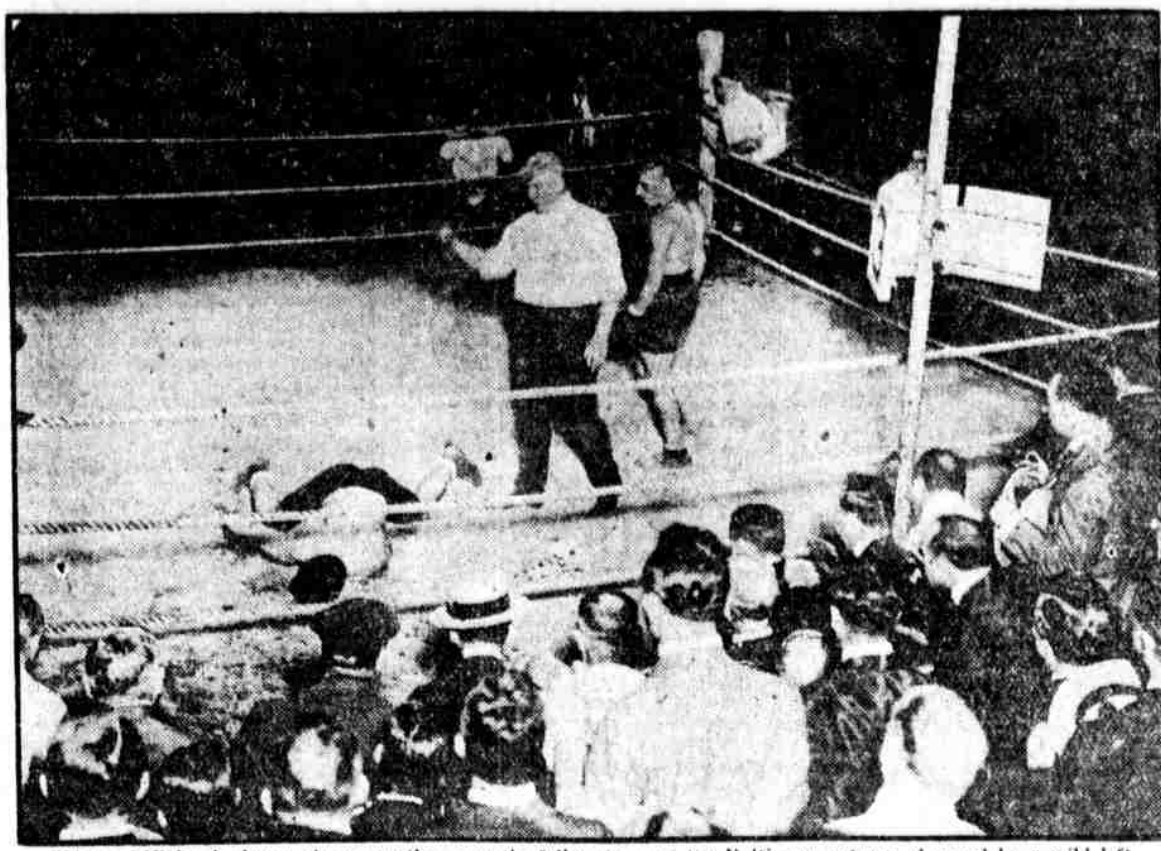
