

AUSTRIAN CABINET DECIDES TO RESIGN

Renner's Dual Job and Viennese Unrest Followed by Collapse of Ministry

By the Associated Press Vienna, July 31.—The Austrian cabinet, headed by Dr. Karl Renner, has decided to resign.

[Austrian affairs have been in an unsettled state. The peace terms have been stoutly protested against in official circles in Vienna, the financial provisions being considered as particularly onerous and predilections being made that Austria was likely to be driven into bankruptcy.

Last week, Dr. Otto Bauer, the foreign minister, resigned because of dissatisfaction at the failure to obtain important advantages for Austria in the peace negotiations. Chancellor Renner, however, took over the duties of the foreign office himself, in addition to those of the chancellorship.]

London, July 31.—(By A. P.)—A message received here from Vienna, by way of Berne, says it has been semi-officially announced in the Austrian capital that the cabinet reached a decision to resign at a meeting held Tuesday.

Luxemburg May Help to Reconstruct Verdun

Luxemburg, July 31.—(By A. P.)—The minister of state proposed in the Chamber of Deputies that 1,000,000 francs (\$200,000) be appropriated for Verdun, expected to be repaired (\$41,800) for the reconstruction of a devastated town in Belgium.

He said France and Belgium deserve the eternal gratitude of the Grand Duchy for aid and protection during the war.

It is expected in French circles that the discussion of the Verdun treaty will open about August 10 in the Chamber of Deputies and will continue for three or four days. There will then be a three or four day discussion in the Senate.

As Japan is supposed to have a copy of the treaty by this time, and the emperor's ratification expected at an early date, French officials are of the opinion that the treaty will become effective when the French ratify, about August 20. England has already ratified the treaty and the signatures of only three great powers are necessary to make it effective.

Herbert C. Hoover and other members of the supreme economic council left Verdun for London, where the council will meet tomorrow to discuss plans for the continuance of interrelated control of supplies.

Division of the German and Austrian warships among the Allies was discussed at length yesterday by the supreme council, but no decision was reached.

The council approved the clause in the Bulgarian treaty guaranteeing the rights of minorities and also the final boundary decisions, which have been delayed through failure to agree on the question of Thrace.

JUSTICE BRANDEIS ENDS PALESTINE TOUR

En Route to Paris, He Reports Jewish Colonies Flourishing

By the Associated Press New York, July 31.—Justice Louis D. Brandeis, of the United States Supreme Court, has completed a tour of Palestine and now is en route to Paris, according to word received here today.

The American jurist, who is honored by the Zionist movement in this country, accompanied by Jacob De Loach, executive secretary, and Professor Alfred Zimmerman, of the University of Wales, a former British foreign minister, visited Jaffa, Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and more than twenty Jewish colonies in Judea, Galilee and Samaria.

Arrival of the visitors, it was said, was the signal for a public holiday in most of the cities and towns, the entire population led by the picturesque shomerim, the Jewish constabulary, marching out to greet them and fetes and receptions were held in their honor.

Equally cordial, it was said, was the reception of the Brandeis party by officers of the British army of occupation, including Generals Shea and Edwards. Secretary De Haas reported that "much was found to encourage the conviction that the league of nations concealing, the Jewish community would begin under favorable auspices because of the accomplishments of the present Jewish population."

Justice Brandeis, it was said, expected to reach this country in time to report to the Zionist convention which will open in Chicago, September 14.

By the Associated Press London, July 31.—(By A. P.)—General Boehm, Hungarian soviet minister of war under Bela Kun, has left Vienna for Budapest to urge Bela Kun to resign voluntarily, according to Vienna dispatches received here today quoting the Neues Wiener Tageblatt.

This step was said to have been taken after the conference between M. Agoston, Hungarian people's commissary, and Colonel Cunningham, the allied representative at Budapest, at which it was agreed the soviet government should be urged to withdraw. The conference's decision to recommend formation of a new Hungarian government, it was said, led to the Hungarian Socialist leaders, Fidoi, Brest and Bichinger, being asked to meet the former Hungarian minister of war under Bela Kun, who he can force to resign.

URGE CANARY WINE TO WAKE LAUREATE

Parliament Gets Hint to Pay Britain's Poet as Ancient Law Provided

London, July 31.—Whether the ancient provision to supply England's poet laureate with canary wine would inspire the mute warbler to burst into song was the question raised in Parliament yesterday afternoon.

Andrew Bonar Law declared he would have to ask the chancellor of the exchequer for the rates on canary wine delivered to poets laureate before commenting on the question.

Horatio Bottomley, editor of John Bull, interjected whether Robert Bridges, the poet laureate, had written anything commemorating Britain's war effort. Bonar Law answered in the negative. Bottomley said: "Is that right honorable gentleman aware that part of the remuneration of the laureate consists of \$500 cash in lieu of a stipulated number of casks of canary wine, and has the government considered the advisability of supplying the wine instead of the cash, in the hope that inspiration may be given thereby?"
