# CHAUFFEUR'S DEATH CONFESSED BY PAIR

Man and Wife, Held for Murder, Admit Killing Philadelphian Also

#### FACE TRIAL IN BALTIMORE

Clarence Cothron and Grace Clark. alias Grace Cothron, who were taken back to Baltimore from Palatka. Fla. on the charge of shooting to death Homer Jones, a negro chauffeur, near Laurel, Md., on June 4 last, and who are wanted on charges in Atlantic City, led the detectives to the spot where they are said to have killed John T. Weldon, a negro chauffeur, of 181 Montrose street, this city, on July 7

"Where is the place you had the fight with Weldon?" asked bendquarters detectives as they drew up in the machine with the prisoners on the Lincoln Highway, about three miles from

Elkton.

"There it is! That is where we bad the fight. We had a fight about my wife. I first struck him, and he came back at me. I shot him three times in the breast and then twice more in the back. He got up and rantoward some huckleberry bushes and fell. I didn't go after him, but my wife and I, together with a friend of ours, Gene by name, drove away in Weldon's car," is the statement the detectives say Cothron made.

Evidence of Shots Evidence of Shots

The confession of Cothron led the detectives to search still more, and a few minutes later they came across the remains of the Philadelphia chauffeur, who had met his death at the hands of the gang. There was distinct evidence that several shots had been fired.

Three weeks ago Cothron and a woman whom he introduced as his wife

went to the home of Weldon, on Montrose street, and told the negro they contemplated taking an automobile tour through the South and wanted to hire him and his machine for a month or so. Weldon was willing, and that day drove the couple away.

Two weeks passed, and as the wife of Weldon had heard no word from her husband she reported his absence to the police. While the police were searching for him word came from Baltimore that a negro named Homer Jones had been murdered by a white man and a woman. The circular stated that the white man hired Jones to drive them on a motor trip through the Southlands. On the circular was a picture of a woman whom friends of Weldon said they recognized as the woman who left in the machine from Philadelphia with Weldon and the white man.

#### Also Kidnapping Charge

Several days later word came from Palatka, Fla., that a man and woman had been arrested in that town, and in their possession was an automobile belonging to Weldon. Detective Joseph Shay was immediately sent to the Florida town and the machine was found to be that of Weldon's. Cothron and his wife were brought back to Elkton yesterday by Detective Shay.

Not only must Cothron stand trial on a double murder charge, but he is also charged with kidnapping nine-year-old Mamie Grosscup, of Baltimore, and taking her to Palatka, Fla.


