I would point out in reply that for the restitution of Kino than detailed arrangements should be worked out beforehand in common accord be-tween the Japanese and Chinese Governments, and that the length of time required for such arrangements depends largely upon the attitude of China. In any case, we fully realize that it is as much in our own interests as in the interests of China to accelerate the con clusion of all needed arrangements and effect, without unnecessary delay. the restitution of leased territory which we have solemnly undertaken."

Uneasy Over Feeling in U. S. Premier Hara and high officials of the Japanese Government discussed frankly with the correspondent what was called the "wave of anti-Japanese feeling" in America. 
