

PRODUCTION OF STEEL IS ON THE INCREASE

Output Would Be Greater Except for Skarried of Skilled and Unskilled Labor

New York, Aug. 16.—Notwithstanding the several adverse influences which made themselves felt in the week just ended, operations of the steel mills of the country showed a tendency to increase. In the Pittsburgh district operations were at the rate of 85 per cent of capacity, while Buffalo reported 80 per cent. The feeling prevails in steel circles that these increases are to be looked for as a matter of course, and would have been greater had it not been for the shortage of both skilled and unskilled labor.
