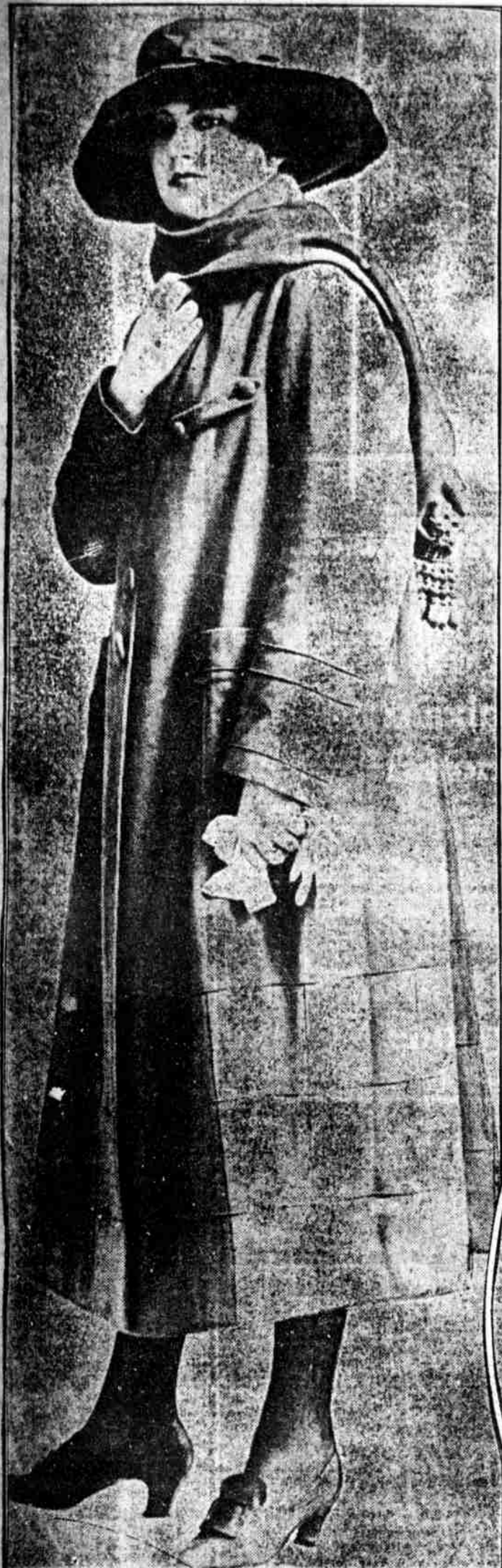


Finished Vessel Launched Sidewise : Swimming With Balloons : Troubadours From Overseas



ONE OF London's newest modes, a coat of royal blue velour, lined with gold hazel silk. The collar forms a novel scarf. For town or country wear.

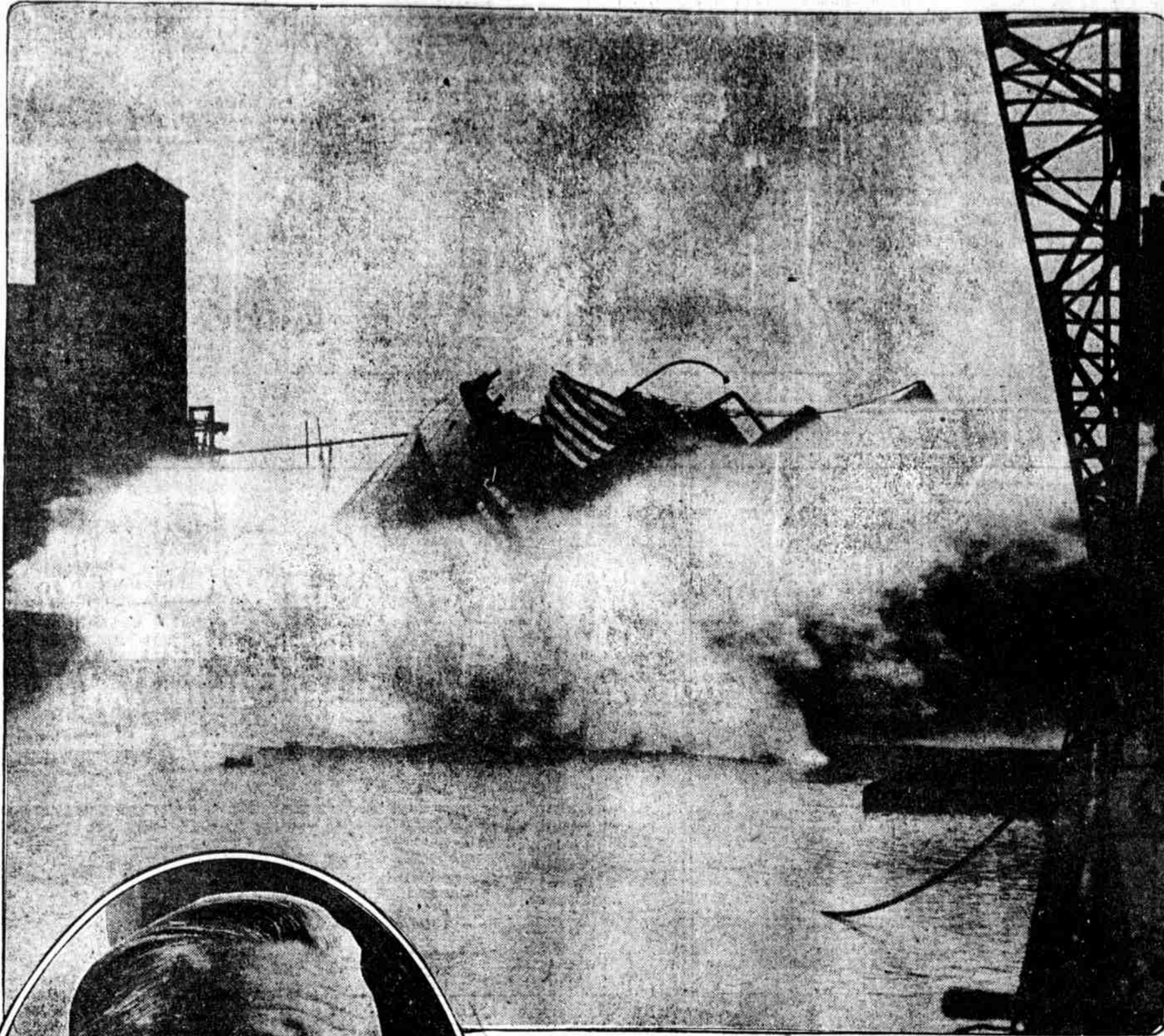

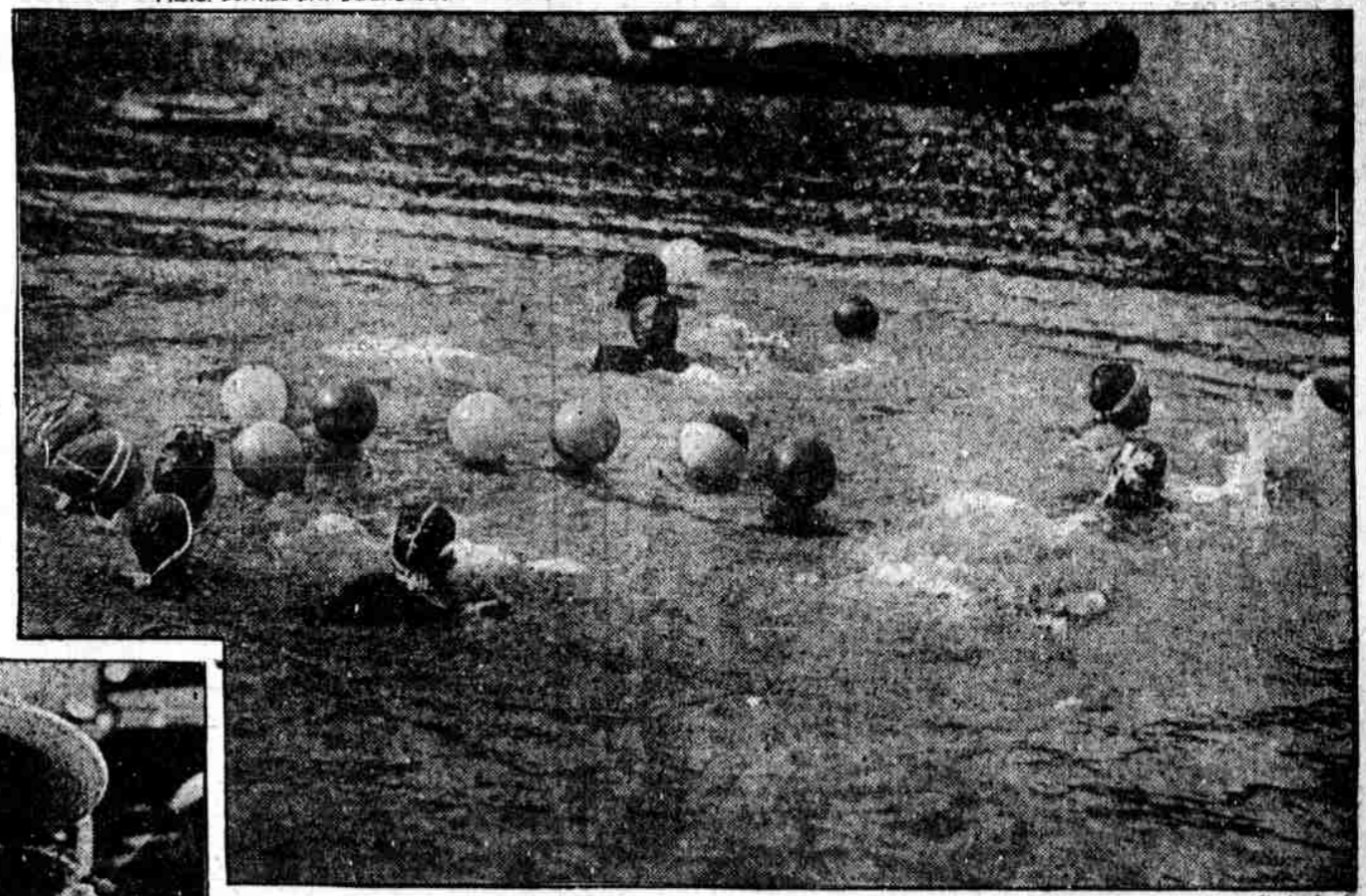
