

**PHILA. SOLDIER DIES  
IN LONDON 'Y' HUT**

German town Man, With Canadian Forces, Victim of Apoplexy, Investigation Reveals

**PREPARING TO COME HOME**

James William Wilcox, whose parents live at 5922 Wayne avenue, was found dead in bed at the Eagle Hut of the American Y. M. C. A., on the Strand, London, August 2. His death was due to apoplexy.

Wilcox was a member of the Canadian Expeditionary Forces, and was stationed at the time of his death at the Winchester repatriation camp in southern England. He was under orders to leave for the United States within a few days.

The body was buried August 6 in a British cemetery, and members of the Royal Army Service Corps gave him military honors.

Wilcox was the only son of William J. and Annie Wilcox. He was twenty-three years old. He enlisted with the Canadian service a year ago last April, and left for France on June 18. He tried to join the Royal Canadian Flying Corps, but was rejected because of high blood pressure.

He served in Italy later, and then was transferred to Egypt and Mesopotamia.

**SEA LIFE ATTRACTS MANY**

**One Thousand Men a Month Ship in Merchant Marine Here**

Sailors from the grade of master down to coal passer, are being shipped for the American merchant marine from Philadelphia at the rate of more than 1000 a month. Simultaneously, men without any sea training are being recruited for the merchant marine training station at East Boston, from this city at the rate of seventy a week.

Hundreds of ex-soldiers, accustomed to a life of freedom in the open, are throwing up clearships and other office jobs, bringing their discharge papers to the office of Lieutenant H. C. White, in charge of recruiting here, and entering the Boston station to follow the life of the sea. The recruits for the training station are received at 139 South Third street. They are paid at the rate of \$30 a month, with their board, lodging and clothing furnished.
