CHESTNUT STREET is minus one of its once-acquainted mid-August figures this year. He could be spotted infallibly by his large black leather portfolio and his velvet hat...

AS PHILADELPHIA is not a "summer-show" town, there has been no word of estimates just what bearing the strike would have on affairs here.

IN RECENT seasons all the half dozen or so first-class houses here have opened with a Labor Day matinee (one of the performances for which, by the way, the actors in New York and who never received pay, in their list of grievances).

The Shubert was to start the season with Al Johnson in "Sinbad," which had a remarkable series of runs in three theatres in New York and in a couple of other cities, on September 1. Then it was announced that the latest announcement is to the effect that Johnson will open the Shubert, but when is not stated...

"LA LA LUCILLE" a musical Broadway which made a big hit on the street is announced for the Garrick opening with a Labor Day matinee. It is being advertised, however, for that date, although it was forced to close in New York during the present week...
