

ARMENIANS IN PERIL AS BRITISH LEAVE

Inhabitants of Caucasus at Mercy of Foes With Departure of Troops

AID OF U. S. INVOKED

Paris, Aug. 28.—British troops began leaving the Caucasus region on August 15 and will all be out of districts where they have been protecting Armenians before September 15, Davis Arnold, of Providence, R. I., managing director of the American committee for relief in the Near East, said today upon his return to Paris from London.

While at the British capital he interviewed Viscount Peel, undersecretary of war, who told him it was impossible for the British to retain troops in Armenia unless the United States should relieve them within two or three months.

Mr. Arnold, who left Constantinople three weeks ago, says it is imperative that Turkey, both European and Asiatic, should be policed by foreign troops. He says if this is not done there will be wholesale massacres.

"For humane reasons," he said, "the United States should accept the mandate for all Turkey. I believe 100,000 Americans could police both European and Asiatic Turkey and keep the country in order for two years, or until local conditions are stabilized.

From 400,000 to 500,000 Armenians now in Russian Armenia will undoubtedly starve or be killed if the British leave without other foreigners entering to act as a police force, as Armenia is being oppressed equally by the Georgians, Turks, Tartars and Kurds. The 40,000 children now being fed by American soldiers inevitably starve if no foreign police force is provided. There are probably another half million Armenian fugitives in southern Russia who want to return home but cannot do so."

DEPUTIES TO APPROVE PEACE TREATY SOON

French Chamber Will Accept Pact First and Discuss Objections Afterward

POST-WAR BILLS FOLLOW

Paris, Aug. 28.—Ratification within a short time of the peace treaty with Germany, now before the Chamber of Deputies, seems probable, despite the views of some elements that France is not guaranteed sufficient military protection by the document, but the ratification vote will not conclude the debate on the treaty. After the pact has been ratified, "motions of regret," embodying the objections to such clauses of the document as have met with criticism, will be presented, thus reopening the debate.

After these are disposed of, the Chamber will pass to discussion of the Anglo-American-French treaty for the protection of France in case of unwarranted aggression by Germany. The debate on this pact is expected to be brief, as the government is considered likely to content itself with making a statement of the circumstances under which the treaty was signed and explaining what protection is afforded by it.

Then the Parliament will take up the amnesty bill, in the controversy over which the opponents of the government are counted upon to marshal all their strength. Next on the program is the bill for the abolition of courts-martial, followed by a measure calling for the division of Alsace and Lorraine into departments, like the other French provinces.

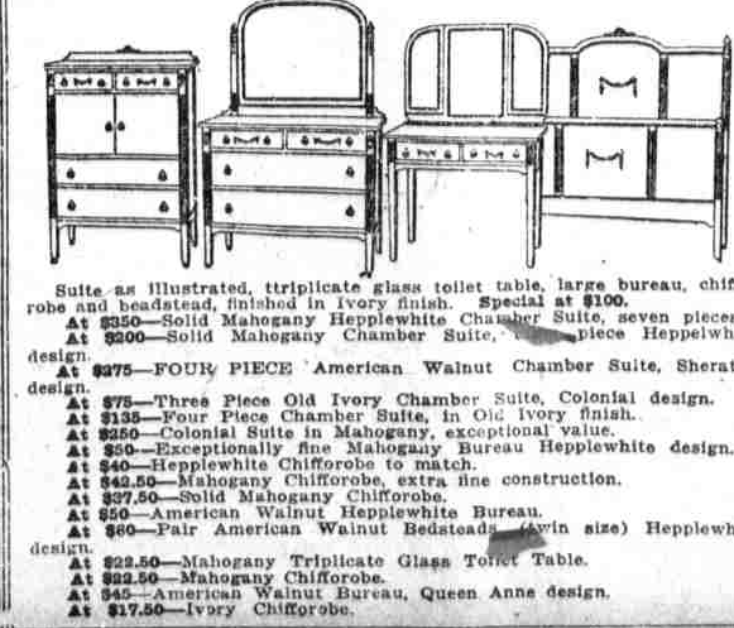

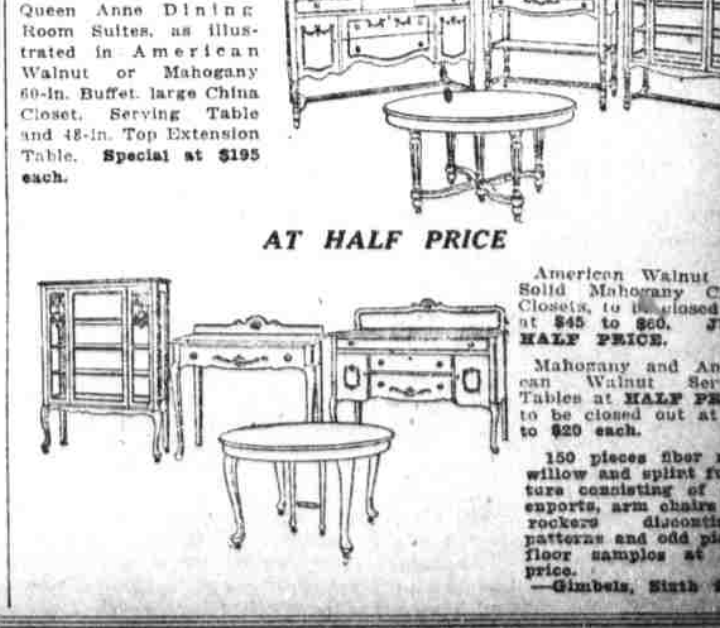
