P.)—Ernest Judet, former owner of the Paris newspaper L'Eclair, who has been indicted in Paris on a charge of having had dealings with the enemy in the purchase or founding of French newspapers with German capital, denied yesterday that he ever had received any of fer from Gottlieb von Jagow, then German minister of foreign affairs, to carry on German propaganda in France. He said that if he had received such an offer he would have rejected it with

Continuing, Judet declared that, during his political career, he had received propositions of all kinds, but never had accepted them, inasmuch as it was his opinion that politics was

Tuesday's Paris newspapers published a letter purporting to have been writ-ten by Von Jagow to Baron von der Lansken, at the time German civil governor of Belgium, saying Von Jagow could obtain the services of Judet for German propaganda in France for the sum of 2,000,000 francs.
