Parigi, 2 settembre.—Il testo del trattato di pace per l'Austria, con le modifiche apportate dalla Conferenza della Pace, e' stato consegnato alla Delegazione Austriaca a St. Germain nel pomeriggio di oggi. L'Austria ha cinque giorni per accettare o rigettare il trattato medesimo.

Gli Alleati nella loro replica alle controproposte austriache dicono che l'Austria e' responsabile anch'essa dello scoppio della guerra coll'ultimatum inviato alla Serbia, dopo l'uccisione del l'Arciduca Francesco Ferdinando.

Gli Alleati sono pronti ad aiutare l'Austria perche' possa adattarsi alla nuova situazione, per essere ammessa nel futuro alla Lega delle Nazioni. Il trattato e' in tre lingue, francese, inglese ed italiana.

Roma, 2 settembre.—Da un comunicato dell'Agenzia Stefani si eleva che il Re d'Italia ha informato il Presidente del Consiglio Nitti, che egli intende rilasciare tutti i beni spettanti ed appartenenti alla Corona, in favore dei mutilati e di quelli che hanno combattuto per la grandezza e l'unita' dell'Italia.

Oltre a vaste zone di terreno, il Re rinuncia a tutti gli edifici che in esse si trovano. I beni della Corona ceduti con tale atto munifico e spontaneo dal Re, saranno a preferenza assegnati a quelle istituzioni speciali destinate ad i ciechi di guerra e mutilati.

Alcuni mesi o sono il Re rinuncio' ad altre proprieta' spettanti alla Corona, per gli stessi scopi benefici e con il recente atto ha voluto dare una prova maggiore della modernita' delle sue vedute e del suo carattere generoso.

Nello stesso comunicato il Re avvertiva il Presidente del Consiglio dei Ministri che per l'avvenire egli vuole che la sua proprieta' sia tassata come quella di tutti gli altri cittadini.

A Palazzo Braschi ha avuto luogo un Consiglio dei Ministri, durante quale e' stato deciso di autorizzare tutti i Prefetti del Regno a permettere ai contadini di recarsi in quelle parti d'Italia ove sono luoghi incolti, allo scopo di sviluppare le terre.

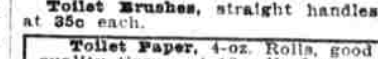

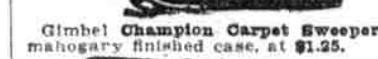

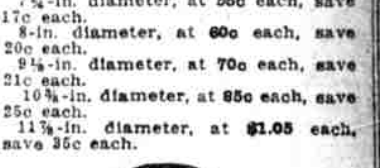
