

# WILSON SAYS ITALY CAN'T ANNEX FIUME

### Internationalization of Port Is Insisted on in Reply to Rome

#### SUPPORTED BY TITTONI

Rome, Sept. 26.—President Wilson's reply regarding the new proposals for the disposition of Fiume has been received, the newspapers announced today. The reply insists upon his original view that the city should be internationalized and not annexed to Italy, becoming the center of a small buffer state between Italy and Jugo-Slavia.

The President does not insist, according to the press, upon a plebiscite in the buffer state at the end of fifteen years, as at first proposed, and he consents to the rectification of the eastern frontier of Istria in favor of Italy, in the district of Albano.

Mr. Wilson's note was discussed at a meeting of the crown council here yesterday, it is reported, but no official comment was made public. King Victor Emmanuel presided.

Tommaso Tittoni, foreign minister, declared at the meeting that the Peace Conference would not permit Italy to annex Fiume, because such action would authorize the Czechoslovaks to occupy Techen, the Jugo-Slavs to move forces into Klagenfurt, the Greeks to claim Thrace and the Rumanians to claim Banat.

The political situation in Italy is apparently near a crisis, according to report, the advocates of the annexation of Fiume including some of the more powerful elements.

# BRITISH RAILWAY STRIKE TONIGHT

### Walkout Order Follows Failure of Wage Conference With Premier

#### 600,000 MEN TO GO OUT

London, Sept. 26.—The conference between the railroad men's representatives and the government for an attempted adjustment of differences on the wage question today resulted in failure and a strike on the railroads has been ordered to take effect tonight at midnight.

The strike will affect probably more than 600,000 men. The government has arranged to have the mails carried by airplanes and to have large motor cars from the government services made available for the conveyance of supplies to the large towns which will be seriously affected.

The locomotive engineers have announced that they would join in the strike, but it is stated that the government has arranged to have many men who drive engines during the war make runs on the principal train service routes.

Printers Firm on 44 Hours New York, Sept. 26.—Representatives of "Big Six" Typographical Union, at a conference yesterday with a committee of the association of employing printers called to consider mediation of differences threatening to bring a walk-out of New York pressmen on October 1, refused to submit to arbitration their demand for a forty-four hour week, although agreeing to arbitrate their demand for \$14 a week increase.

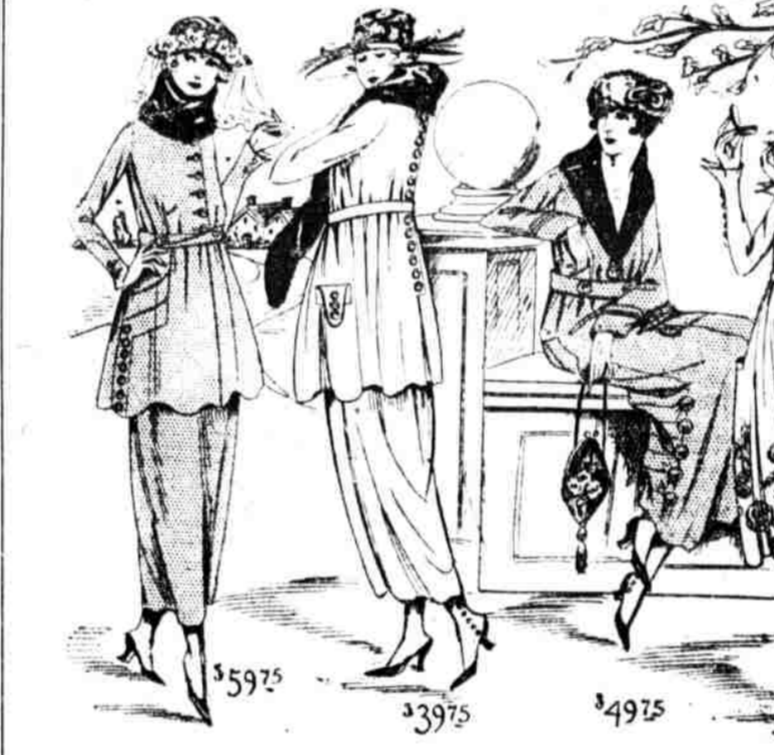
