

RENEE BOUCAULT FILES MORE SUITS

Granddaughter of Actor-Author Sues Husband to Recover Heirlooms and Jewels

ACTION STARTED IN N. Y.

Still another tangle has been added to the affairs of Mrs. Renee Boucault, granddaughter of Dion Boucault, who recently came here from New York and is living at the St. James Hotel. Mrs. Boucault has filed three more suits against her husband, Alexander Mack, known also as Alexander or Howard E. Boucault, whom she had arrested here on September 22 in a dispute over possession of their twenty-two-month-old child.

This time Mrs. Boucault is suing her husband for the return of heirlooms, works of art and jewelry which she says he took from her. One of the articles named in her suits is a tapestry and lace embroidered bedspread, which was presented to Dion Boucault by his admirers when he was in the zenith of his career as actor-playwright. She says her husband took the bedspread, which she values at \$2500, with works of art worth \$15,000.

Her suits were filed in New York, but the affidavits supporting the actions were made in Philadelphia.

Mrs. Boucault gives a long list of jewels which, she says, her husband has taken from her.

The suits were brought in New York because the husband lives in the Bronx, that city, although Mrs. Boucault is

now making her home here. When Mrs. Boucault first came here, her husband followed and, accompanied by a detective, tried to carry off their child, according to Mrs. Boucault.

Mrs. Boucault has numerous other suits in the courts. One of these is in connection with the estate of her grandfather on the maternal side, Isaac E. Holbrook, plateglass manufacturer, of Pittsburgh, who left her \$170,000 in trust. She became of age last February and wants the trustees to place the entire estate in her hands.

TOMORROW IS THRIFT DAY

School Children Will Be Urged to Save Each Week

Thrift registration day will be observed tomorrow in schools throughout the city, when a special message from Secretary of the Treasury Carter Glass will be read. The "day" will be observed not only in Philadelphia, but throughout the country, and it is estimated that twenty million school boys and girls will hear the message.

Special exercises will be observed. They include a registration of pupils who signify their intention of saving money each week and will begin depositing their money to be invested in thrift and savings stamps.

It is also announced that certificates of achievement will be issued by the Treasury Department as a record and in recognition of the efforts of the school children to save money and buy government securities.

highways from the New Jersey side of the Delaware river over which tens of thousands of motorists may stream with a minimum of road discomforts.

The plan is to link Atlantic City with Philadelphia, New York, Baltimore and Washington by splendid highways made as perfect as modern road-building arts can achieve.

At present large sections of the roads are being constructed by the state of New Jersey, with hotel interests co-operating.

"Although fall business is at a seasonal top peak, Atlantic City in a sense is taking its breath now that the last wave of summer visitors is receding. Attention has swung to the immense building projects planned for the Chel-

sea district. An \$8,000,000 Ritz-Carlton Hotel will rise on the site acquired by the Ritz-Carlton and Linnard Hotel systems, and the capacity of the new Hotel Ambassador is to be doubled.

Besides these improvements a convention hall will be built, large enough to care for the needs of any national gathering. A village of California bungalows will be created and a series of arcades and apartments built.

When construction work on the proposed Ritz-Carlton Hotel is begun, it was announced today, work will be started also on a six-story brick hotel to house employees of the Ritz-Carlton and the enlarged Ambassador, as well as the servants of guests of the two hotels.
