

# WOULD CUT RUSSIA FROM WORLD MART

### Supreme Council Note Shows Germany Did Not Receive Sole Invitation

## BOLSHEVIST ENMITY CITED

London, Oct. 17.—The text of the note of the supreme council inviting Germany to participate in the blockade of Russia, as published by the Berlin Tageblatt and reprinted by the Daily Herald, shows that Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Holland, Finland, Spain, Switzerland, Mexico, Chile, Argentina, Colombia and Venezuela have been invited to initiate measures to prevent their nationals from engaging in any trade whatever with Bolshevik Russia. The measures are thus enumerated:

"First. Refusal of permission to sail to every ship bound for a Russian Bolshevik port and the closing of all ports to ships from Bolshevik ports.

"Second. Similar regulations to be adopted with regard to all goods destined for Russia by any other route."

"Third. Passports will be refused to all persons to or from Bolshevik Russia. Isolated exceptions may be made by agreement of the allied and associated powers.

"Fourth. Measures will be taken to hinder the banks from granting credit to commercial undertakings in Bolshevik Russia.

"Fifth. Every government will refuse its nationals any facilities of intercourse with Bolshevik Russia, whether by post or wireless telegraphy."

Marshal Foch added the following instruction:

"Inform the German Government that the British and French men-of-war in the gulf of Finland will continue to blockade Bolshevik ports and detain from the moment they come in sight ships bound for Bolshevik ports."

The preamble to the note declares that the open enmity of the Bolsheviks is directed against all governments and that programs of international revolution circulated by them constitute a grave danger to the national security of all the powers. Every increase in the capacity of the Bolsheviks for resistance increases this danger, and it would be desirable that all nations wishing peace and the re-establishment of social order should unite to resist Bolshevik government.

For this reason, it is further declared, the allied and associated governments, after raising the blockade of Germany, have refused permission to their subjects to resume commercial relations with Bolshevik Russia.

The German Government is requested to take measures in conformity, with those enumerated.

## CAILLAUX HEARING OCT. 25

Former French Premier Wants Bail So He May Seek Vote

Paris, Oct. 17.—Joseph Caillaux, former premier of France, who is under arrest charged with intriguing to bring about a premature dissolution of the peace with Germany, will appear before the high court of the Senate on October 25, at which time the accusation against him will be read and the date of his trial determined.

M. Moro-Giafferi, his attorney, will ask that M. Caillaux be admitted to bail in order that he may be a candidate in the constituency of Sarthe, where he has been chosen as a nominee by the radical party in the event the high court agrees to a postponement of the trial and will permit M. Caillaux to go before the voters.

If this request is refused M. Moro-Giafferi will ask that the trial be deferred for six weeks, owing to the impossibility of bringing witnesses from America in less time.

## TYPHUS RAGING IN SIBERIA

### American Red Cross Will Establish Quarantine Stations Along Railway

Omak, Oct. 17.—(By A. P.)—The American Red Cross has undertaken to establish and administer quarantine stations along the Trans-Siberian Railroad in an effort to stamp out typhus, which is spreading at an alarming rate. This work was undertaken at the request of Admiral Kolehnik.

The visit of Colonel Rudolph Balling Tensler, in charge of Red Cross work in Siberia, to Omak has resulted in a plan of co-operation between the Russian civil and military authorities.

Conditions may be judged from observations made by Colonel Tensler en route to this city from the East. At Inokentievskaya, near Irkutsk, he found 300 patients without blankets, in barren barracks and attended by convalescents. In filthy box cars in front of the barracks were 1000 other patients, among whom there are from twenty to thirty deaths daily. Several thousand more in a similar condition were found between Irkutsk and Omak, all being virtually without attention.

## BALTIC MOVE REPUDIATED

### Berlin Disclaims Warlike Intention Against Letts or Russians

Berlin, Oct. 17.—The German Government's reply to the demands of the Allies concerning the evacuation of the Baltic provinces has been handed to Marshal Foch.

The reply points out that General von Goltz, the former German commander, has been recalled and repudiates any warlike intentions by Germany against either the Lettish or Russian peoples.

# VERSO UN ACCORDO RIGUARDO A FIUME

Washington, D. C., 15 ottobre.—Si apprende che il Segretario di Stato Lansing è stato in conferenza con il Regio Ambasciatore Italiano, Conte Maechi di Cellere, relativamente ad una nuova proposta del Governo Italiano sulla sistemazione del problema Adriatico. Prima di oggi le discussioni al riguardo non avevano avuto un carattere ufficiale.

Il Presidente del Consiglio dei Ministri, On. Nitti, ed il Ministro per gli Affari Esteri d'Italia, On. Tommaso Tittoni, avrebbero trovato una nuova soluzione per sistemare la tanto dibattuta questione di Fiume e della costa della Dalmazia.

In breve si può dire che la nuova proposta considera il piano per la creazione di uno Stato cinetico con Fiume come centro, mentre l'Italia annetterebbe il distretto di Volosca che giace tra Fiume e Trieste, allo scopo di stabilire un confine continuo tra l'Italia ed il proposto nuovo stato di Fiume. Il piano contempla la internazionalizzazione del porto di Fiume, sotto il controllo della Lega delle Nazioni.

Tale proposta è sviluppata sulle linee generali del compromesso che fu

notizia che il Barone Romano Avezzano succederà al Conte Maechi di Cellere.

Roma, 16 ottobre.—Giuseppe Brambilla, consigliere presso l'Ambasciata Italiana in Londra, è stato trasferito all'Ambasciata in Washington. Sua moglie è figlia del defunto George Venet, Meyer di Boston.

Si ritiene che il Conte Maechi di Cellere sia stato incaricato dal Governo di raggiungere un completo accordo con il Governo Americano, prima che avvenga un formale scambio di vedute.
