# **WOULD CUT RUSSIA** FROM WORLD MART

Supreme Council Note Shows Germany Did Not Receive Sole Invitation

#### BOLSHEVIST ENMITY CITED

By the Associated Press London, Oct. 17 .- The text of the note of the supreme council inviting Germany to participate in the blockade of Russia, as published by the Berlin Tageblatt and reprinted by the Daily Herald, shows that Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Holland, Finland, Spain, Switzerland, Mexico, Chile, Argentina, Colombia and Venezuela have been invited to initiate measures to prevent their nationals from engaging in any trade whatever with Bolshevist Russia. The measures are thus enumerated:

"First. Refusal of permission to sail to every ship bound for a Russian Bol-shevist port and the closing of all ports to ships from Bolshevist ports.

"Second. Similar regulations to be adopted with regard to all goods Marshal Foch, destined for Russia by any other The reply p

ciated powers.

"Fourth. Measures will be taken to hinder the banks from granting credit to commercial undertakings in Bolshevist Russia.

"Fifth. Every government will re-fuse its nationals any facilities of inter-course with Bolshevist Russia, whether by post or wireless telegraphy." Marshal Foch added the following in-

Marshal Foch added the following instruction:

"Inform the German Government that the British and French men-of-war in the gulf of Finland will continue to blockade Bolshevist ports and detain from the moment they come in sight ships bound for Bolshevist ports."

The preamble to the note declares that the open enmity of the Bolshevists is directed against all governments and that programs of international revolution circulated by them constitute a grave danger to the national security of all the powers. Every increase in the capacity of the Bolshevists for resistance increases this danger, and it would be desirable that all nations wishing peace and the re-establishment of social order should unite together to resist Bolshevist government.

For this reason, it is further declared, the allied and associated governments, after raising the blockade of Germany, have refused permission to their subjects to resume commercial relations with Bolshevist Russia.

The German Government is requested to take measures in conformity, with those enumerated.

## CAILLAUX HEARING OCT. 25

Former French Premier Wants Ball So He May Seek Vote

Paris, Oct. 17.—Joseph Caillaux, former premier of France, who is under arrest charged with intriguing to bring shout a premature and dishonorable peace with Germany, will appear before the high court of the Senate on October 25, at which time the accusation against him will be read and the date of his trial determined.

If this request is refused M. Moro-Giafferi will ask that the trial be deferred for six weeks, owing to the impossibility of bringing witnesses from America in less time.

# TYPHUS RAGING IN SIBERIA

Quarantine Stations Along Rallway

Omsk, Oct. 17.— (By A. P.)—The
American Red Cross has undertaken to
establish and administer quarantine stations along the Trans-Siberian Railroad in an effort to stamp out typhus,
which is sprending at an alarming rate.
This work was undertaken at the request of Admiral Kolchak.
The visit of Colonel Rudolph Balling
Teusler, in charge of Red Cross work
in Siberia, to Omsk has resulted in a
plan of co-operation between the Russian civil and military authorities.
Conditions may be judged from observations made by Colonel Teusler en
route to this city from the East. At
Inokentievskaya, near Irkutsk, he found
300 patients without blankets, in barren
barracks and attended by convalescents.
In filthy box cars in front of the barracks were 1000 other patients, among
whom there are from twenty to thirty
deaths daily. Several thousand more
in a similar condition were found between Irkutsk and Omsk, all being virtually without attention.

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
