New York, Oct. 25.—The New York Evening Sun's financial review today says: The labor situation in general and the seeming inevitability of a coal strike on the verge of the winter season brought about a considerable selling movement in today's short session of the stock market.

BANK CLEARINGS EXPAND

Strikes in various parts of the country urge a curb on the satisfaction which is being derived from the evidence of business activity, according to Dun's Review in its weekly survey of conditions.

Developments at the industrial conference in Washington, which it was hoped would promote more settled conditions, have not been reassuring, and the uncertainty of the labor situation nearly everywhere prompt hesitation and set as a check on new enterprise.

The largest bank clearings ever recorded for this period continue at various important centers, the total this week at twenty leading cities in the United States amounting to \$8,617,634,940, which represents increases of 25.3 and 51.1 per cent, respectively over the corresponding weeks in 1918 and 1917.

Headstart's says: Prices are stable, however, and steady, and official and other price comparisons, while reflecting a fair leveling of food price levels at wholesale prices, point to only a slight reduction in the entire list, with retail prices slow to follow wholesale quotations downward.

Manufacturing, though crippled by strikes or labor in various parts of the country, is active, with a majority of reports indicating efforts being made to fill piled up orders. The above refers to what might be termed the "direct" factors, however, since to present a rather different picture, mainly because of the increasingly arbitrary attitude of organized labor in meeting this attitude of organized labor and threats of "direct action" by the unions is an undeniable stiffening of the attitude of employers in nearly every line, which makes the industrial outlook an unusually clouded one.
