


Cue Wizard, With Rating of 47 3-51 Per Inning, Breaks All Former Marks



New York, Oct. 27 .- William Hoppe New York, Oct. 27.—William Hoppe is the inquestioned monarch of bil-blards. When he defented Young Jake Schaefer by a score of 400 to 214 in the sixth and final match of the tour-nament at the Astor Hotel last Satur-day night it gave the cuc wizard a clean record for the week, the only un-beaten contestant. Hoppe completely outclassed the field. He set a new world's record for a tournament average with a 47 3-51 rating per inning for the fifty-one nec-essary to win the six games. Twenty-eight was the best previous record. The new king made his 2400 points while his six opponents were collecting 1236. He virtually single discounted the opposition all the way. He failed to get the high run record for the tournamient, but his strady, consistent work proved this—his wing

consistent work proved this—his win was merited. Cochran had the high run of 265, but

Cochran had the high run of 265, but his game was erratic. His best rating for the tournament was less than twenty per inning. It was well known before the tourney that Cochran expected an average of not more than thirty would win. But he overlooked Hoppe. The champion's poorest exhibition was against Schaefer, when it required twelve innings for him to win. He fell

This would have given him a grand average of more than fifty. Morningstar was tied with Cochran in the standing, but had a better grand average. In this respect he was second to the champion, with more than twenty-six, which is almost good enough to win any championship tourney. tourney.
