

EDWARDS ELECTED GOVERNOR OF N. J.

With Only 19 Districts Missing "Web" Candidate Leads Bugbee by 13,715

LEGISLATURE IS REPUBLICAN

Trenton, Nov. 5.—(By A. P.)—State Senator Edward J. Edwards, Democrat, running on an avowedly "web" platform, was elected governor of New Jersey yesterday in a close contest with State Comptroller Newton A. K. Bugbee, his Republican opponent.
