Best Color for Spats
 Dear Madam—Please describe what shade of spats would go best with drab-colored silvertone velvet coat; also, what will rid good carpet of tiny white worms?

 Tan spats would look well with this coat, or, if you want them for dressy occasions, a pair of those very light tan, biscuit-colored ones. These would not be practical for everyday wear, as they are too easily soiled. Try putting salt on the places in the carpet where the worms appear. If this does not kill them, get an insect powder. There are a number of very good ones on the market.

Cleaning Ermine Fur
 Dear Madam—Can you kindly, through your columns, give me any information as to cleaning an ermine stole without injuring the fur?
 CONSTANT READER.
 Clean your stole by rubbing it with moistened bran, until the bran is quite dry, applying with a flannel cloth. Rub it afterward with dry bran, and brush it thoroughly and carefully to remove every piece of the bran. This will not injure the fur.

You could make pockets of the ribbons for handkerchiefs, fastening the edges with blanket stitching, or you might cover the two open sides of a block of pins with colored heads, or cover an embroidery hoop with ribbon and fill it in on one side to make a shallow tray for a dressing table. Tiny little bows for lacy camisoles would be appreciated by the girl who draws them, or one of the bandeaux for evening that are so popular again. Stick a short hatpin through a pink ribbon, then puff the ribbon around the head of the pin in the shape of a rose. I hope these suggestions will be helpful.
