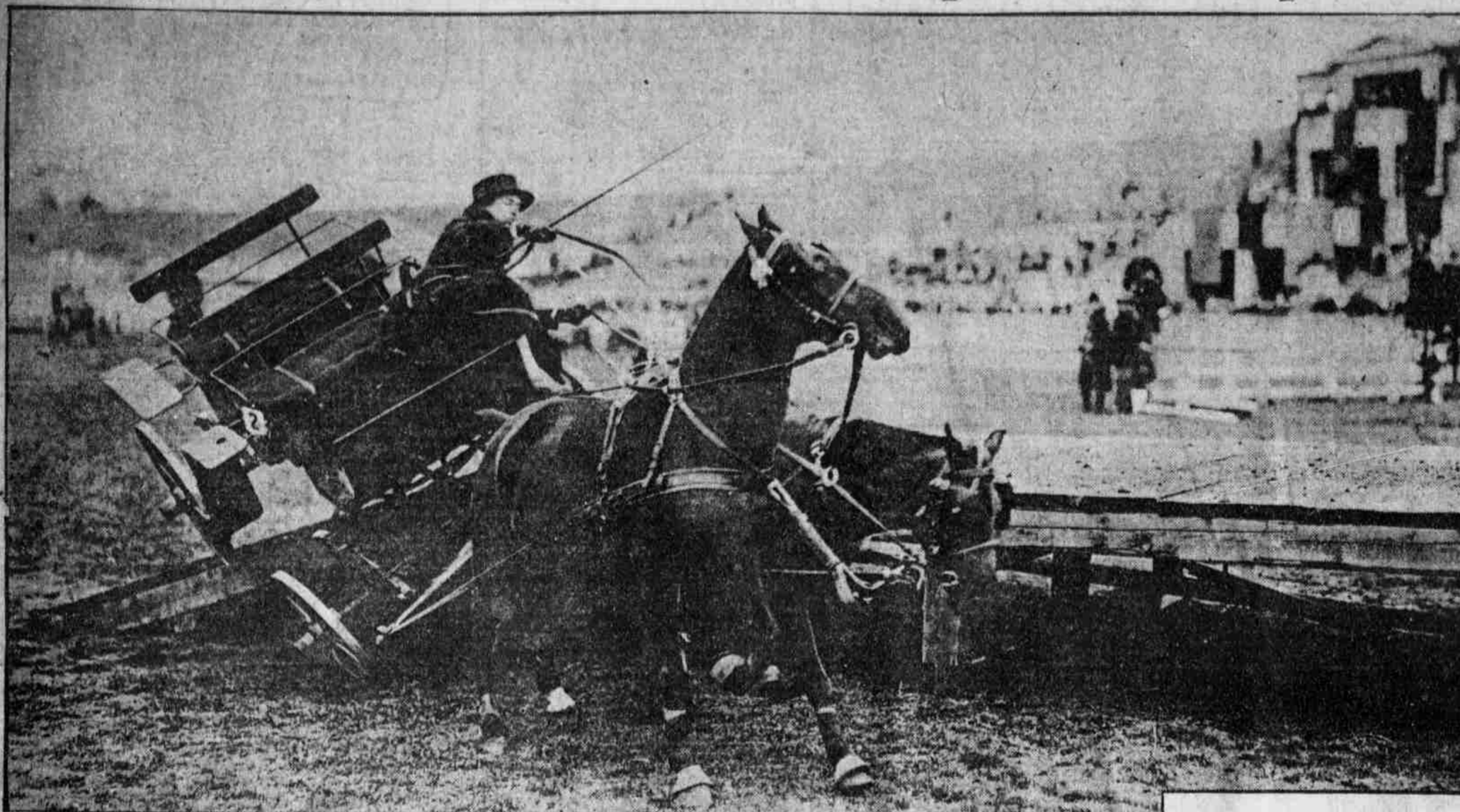


Racing Over Obstructions : Alaskan Explorer : Champion Hunter : American Polo on Rhine

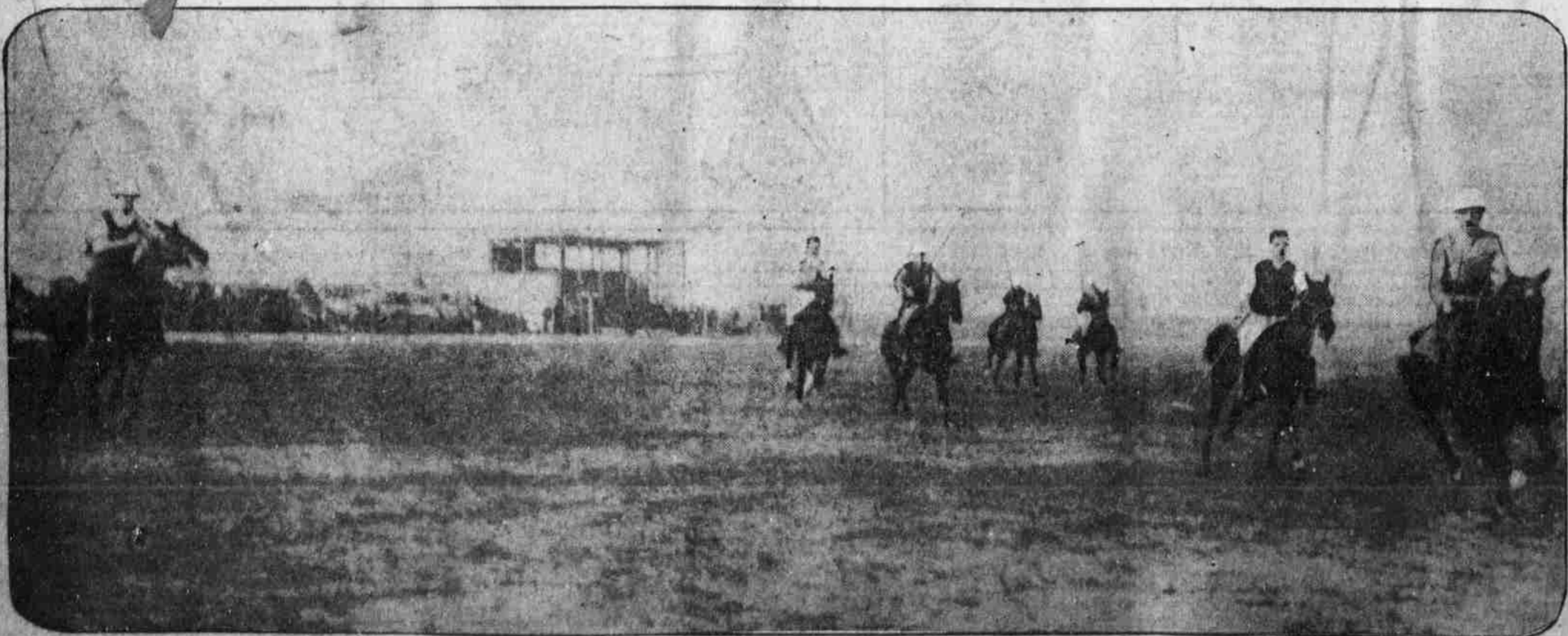
