"The national convention of the American Legion at Minneapolis fixed the amount of national dues at \$1 per annum, the same to include a subscription to the American Legion Weekly Magazine. The national executive committee on November 13 ruled that all persons becoming members of the American Legion between November 11, 1919, and January 1, 1920, shall nay \$1 dues, which will carry them to December 31, 1920. All members enrolled prior to November 11, 1819, will be carried as paid up to December 31, 1919. Local posts will be responsible for the dues for 1919 of all men whose names were reported to state head-quarters prior to November 14.

"The state convention at Harrisburg fixed the amount of state dues at 50 cents per annum. The same adjustment with regard to new members received after November 11 applies as in the case of national dues.

"Printed forms will shortly be sent to all local posts on which to report

"Printed forms will shortly be sent to all local posts on which to report the membership and remittances for 1929. All official membership cards will be forwarded from this office for all paid-up members for 1920.

"A number of posts have remitted dues at the rate of thirty-live cents

per member since November 11 without stating whether or not these dues, or any part of them, were collected prior to that date. As this may make a difference in the balance due for 1920 pest finance officers who have failed to supply this information should do so at once. In case this report is not made within ten days the sums so received will be credited on account of dues received from members since November 11.


