

SOCIALISTS PIQUED, CALL ROME STRIKE

Police and Military Take Precautions to Prevent Disorder in Streets

CHAMBER RESUMES SESSION

By the Associated Press. Rome, Dec. 3.—Extraordinary police and military measures were taken yesterday to prevent disorders. Troops were held in the vicinity of the Chamber of Deputies, where machine guns were kept in readiness; armed cars circulated through the main thoroughfares of the city, while cavalry and mounted carabinieri patrolled the center of the capital.

The meeting of the chamber was resumed, notwithstanding the general strike proclaimed by the Socialists as a protest against their having been beaten in street demonstrations Monday evening.

Walls in the city were placarded with manifestos exhorting the Italian workers, and calling upon them not to delay action in favor of their Russian revolutionary brethren. The placards declared that Russia's example must be followed by all the enlightened proletarians, and urged the workmen to refuse to make arms or munitions destined for Russia.

The anti-Socialist newspapers were enthusiastic in their praise of the speech of King Victor Emmanuel before Parliament, and the anti-Socialist demonstration inside and outside the Chamber of Deputies. The Giornale d'Italia, noting that the Catholics participated in the loyal demonstrations, suggests that the moment is ripe for the forming of a compact union of all the national forces, which it says may comprise 350 deputies. Many other newspapers comment with satisfaction on the demonstration against the radical forces.

The Avanti adds that the king's government was responsible for all the "infamies" against the vanquished contained in the Versailles treaty, and says: "The government does not desire new wars, yet it allows the country to be flooded with imbecile stories about Adriatic aspirations."

GOULD PROTESTS ALIMONY

Frank J. Brings Suit Questioning French Court's Jurisdiction

Versailles, Dec. 3.—(By A. P.)—Former Premier Rene Viviani appeared for Frank J. Gould yesterday at a hearing on a motion by Mrs. Gould, from whom Mr. Gould recently obtained a divorce. The motion claimed the French courts had no jurisdiction to grant separation and alimony.

M. Viviani, who admitted she had no domicile in France, maintained that in appealing against the judgment of the court she implicitly recognized French jurisdiction.

DENIKINE'S TROOPS BEATEN IN UKRAINE

New Kolchak Cabinet Chosen. Reds Take Town 100 Miles East of Omsk

Berne, Dec. 3.—(By A. P.)—The Ukrainian mission here has been informed that General Petlura's Ukrainian forces, after heavy fighting against the troops of General Denikin, the anti-Bolshevik leader in South Russia, took the towns of Ekaterinoslav, Poltava and Berditseff, together with much war material and foodstuffs. The Ukrainian Government announces that two strong armies—Ukrainian and Galician—have joined in the fight against Denikin.

Irkutsk, Siberia, Nov. 29.—(By A. P.)—The Bolsheviks have occupied the town of Tatarskaya, about 100 miles east of Omsk on the Trans-Siberian Railway. The American consulate and the Red Cross have evacuated Tomsk.

Washington, Dec. 3.—(By A. P.)—The personnel of the new Kolchak cabinet has been announced in official advices from Irkutsk. The premier is Papanov, who holds the portfolio of minister of the interior; Tretinikov becomes vice president of council and acting minister of foreign affairs; Bourishkine becomes minister of finance, and for the time being the new minister of war will be General Kluzhinski. The incumbents were retained in the other offices.

SCIOPERO A ROMA FIRENZE E MILANO

In Roma la Popolazione Attacca i Socialisti e li Malmena

Roma, 3 dicembre.—Lo sciopero generale è stato proclamato a Roma, Milano e Firenze. A Milano soltanto si ebbero a deplorare disordini di una certa entità e due persone e rimasero uccise e parecchie altre ferite.

Due dei feriti di Milano morirono poi nell'ospedale. Durante una dimostrazione a Roma fu fatto fuoco sopra i carabinieri questi più tardi ripresero al fuoco uccidendo una persona e ferendone altre sei.

Alla mezzanotte tutti i pubblici servizi funzionavano regolarmente. Il Popolo Romano e l'Osservatore Romano sono gli unici giornali che si pubblicano nella capitale. Nelle dette tre città vi sono state dimostrazioni di socialisti da una parte e di nazionalisti dall'altra. Alcuni deputati socialisti passando in Roma, per piazza Colonna, furono insultati e

sestavati dalla forza pubblica dall'ira popolare. Strordinarie misure di polizia e militari sono state prese dalle autorità. Riparti di truppa stazionario nelle vicinanze della Camera dei Deputati, ove sono state piazzate anche delle mitragliatrici puntate per qualsiasi eventualità. Carri armati percorrono le principali vie della città, mentre reparti di cavalleria e di carabinieri montati stazionano nelle piazze.

La seduta alla Camera dei Deputati è stata ripresa nonostante che i socialisti avessero fatto proclamare lo sciopero generale per protestare per essere stati battuti durante le dimostrazioni di lunedì sera.

Sui muri della città sono stati affissi dei manifesti che fanno appello ai lavoratori per un'azione in favore dei rivoluzionari russi, e di rifiutarsi dal fare armi e munizioni destinate per la Russia.

L'on. Orlando è stato eletto presidente della Camera con voti 251 contro 143, ricevuti da Lazzari candidato dei socialisti.

socialisti. Prima della detta elezione i deputati socialisti prestarono il giuramento e in cerimonia diede luogo a qualche incidente. Il Deputato Abba di Genova disse: Io giuro, ma (salsamente, non intervenne alla seduta perché) confinato in letto per le ferite ricevute durante la dimostrazione di lunedì sera. I compagni di lui alla Camera lanciarono invettive contro Nitti e specialmente contro il generale Alberici, ministro della guerra, che accusano di permettere agli ufficiali di battere i socialisti.

A vice-presidenti della Camera sono stati eletti gli onorevoli De Nava, Meda, Cluffelli e Berenini.

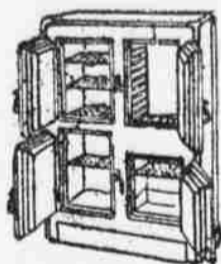
