

L'ATTESO ANNUNZIO RIGUARDO FIUME

Nitti Probabilmente Domani Comunichera' la Soluzione alla Camera dei Deputati

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Roma, 16 dicembre. — I giornali "L'Espresso" ed il "Giornale d'Italia" esprimono oggi la speranza che un annuncio sulla soluzione della controversia di Fiume sarà fatto dal Presidente del Consiglio, On. Nitti, nella seduta di domani alla Camera dei Deputati. (I giornali di Roma annunzieranno ieri che probabilmente D'Annunzio sarebbe giunto oggi in Roma per conferire con Nitti. Il rappresentante dell'ufficio stampa di D'Annunzio dichiarato domenica che la questione di Fiume era stata sistemata con un accordo tra Francia, Inghilterra ed Italia. L'Italia avrebbe la completa sovranità sopra Fiume e tutti i territori stabiliti dal patto di Londra.)

Parigi, 16 dicembre. — Commentando il rapporto ricevuto tra Nitti e D'Annunzio il "Petit Parisien" rammenta che gli Alleati notificarono il Governo Italiano che l'aggiustamento dell'incidente di D'Annunzio era soltanto una cosa interna. Il giornale aggiunge che

anche il Governo Italiano ha sistemato ciò che è interamente italiano, o rimane che a sistemare le questioni internazionali coinvolte.
