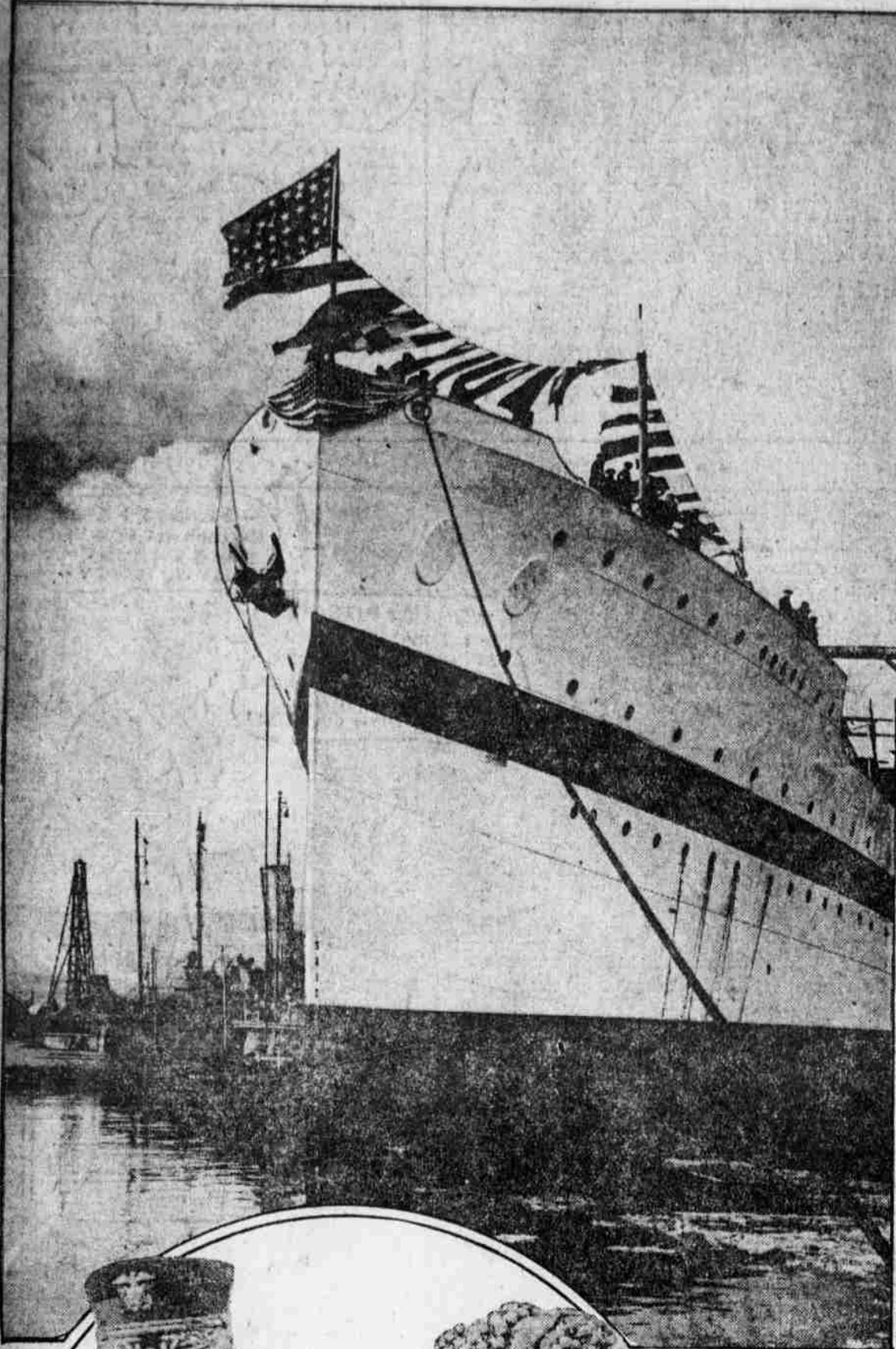


Hospital Ship Relief : Golf Clubs Entertain Their Caddies : Marines Back From Germany

The vessel receives its name from the former converted hospital ship Relief, which saw service in the Spanish-American War and which accompanied the United States fleet on its cruise around the world in 1908.
