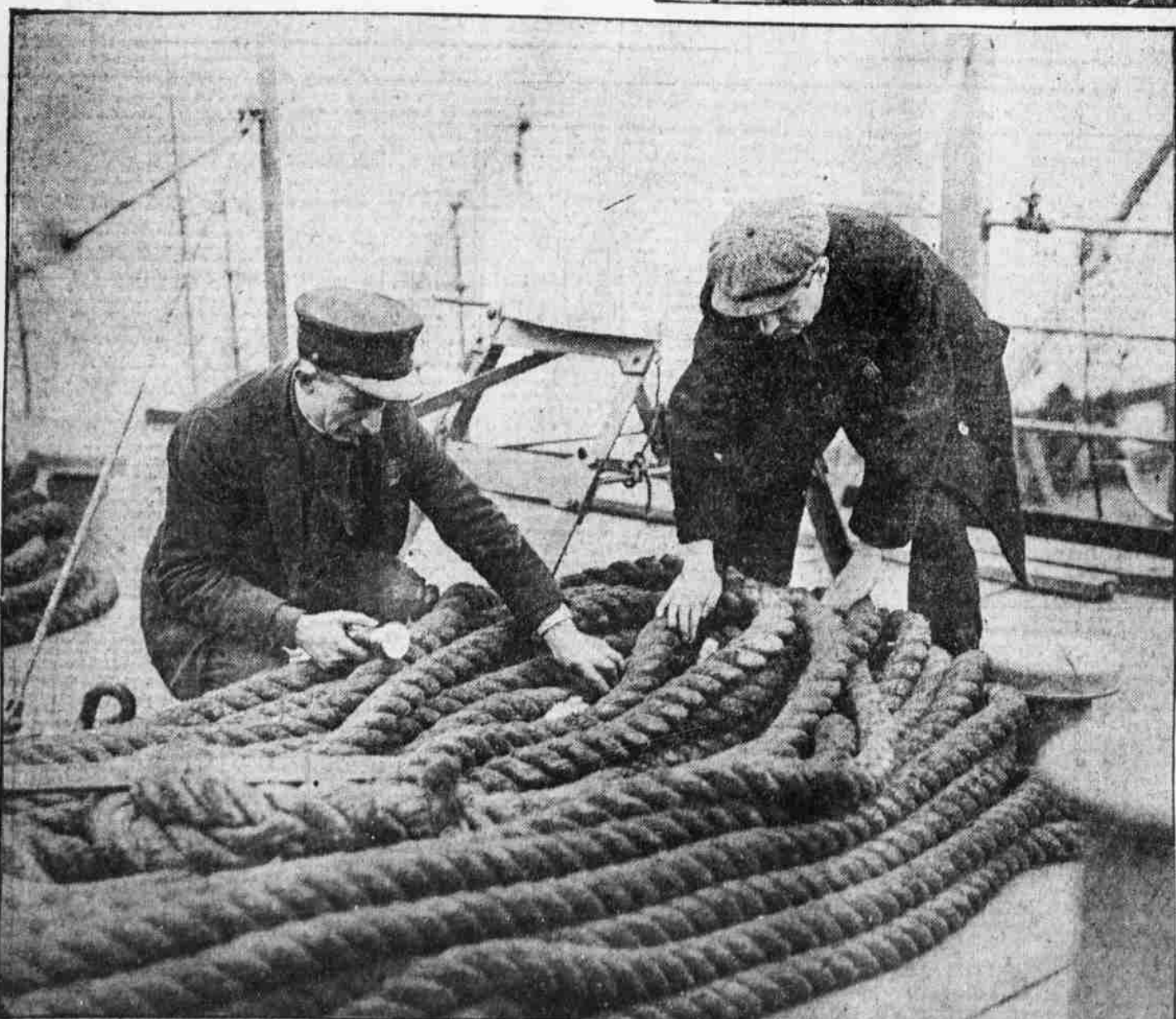
ALEXANDER BALFOUR SMITH handles his new thoroughbred with expert horsemanship.
