

STREETS FLOODED AS MAIN BURSTS

Thousands of Gallons Deluge Thoroughfares at Huntingdon and Sartain Streets

ICE TWO INCHES THICK

The streets for several blocks in the vicinity of Huntingdon and Sartain streets are covered with a solid sheet of ice two inches in thickness which resulted when an eighteen-inch water main burst and thousands of gallons of water poured into the streets for three hours.

The water main burst at 2 o'clock this morning and the flow of water was not shut off until 5 o'clock. By that time Sartain and Huntingdon streets at their intersection, was a veritable ice cake which extended to Twelfth street and thence to Cumberland.

The young folks of the neighborhood looked out this morning, saw the glazing ice surface and made a dash for their skates and sleds, and, oh, boy!

"Ain't this great, and it's going to last all day."

But some of the residents did not think it was so great. The cellar in nearly every house in the 1100 block on Huntingdon street was flooded and frozen.

The water flooded the basements of William Schenbinger, at 1128 Huntingdon street, and damaged several barrels of flour.

FEAST OF THE BEAN IS HERE; TWELFTH NIGHT, IF YOU WILL

Epiphany, Observed in Church Calendar, Once Festival for Poor and Later Marked Misrule's Reign

This is the day of the bean feast. The man who desires to become king of the season of hilarity that ends with the beginning of lent, must be careful to select as his piece of cake the one with the bean in it.

This year, of course, a lady should be fortunate because it is leap year, and the lord of misrule should be a lady, for the old custom sometimes crowned a man, sometimes a woman, and at other times crowned both.

Twelfth Night has faded and almost disappeared from the calendar of annual festivals during the last hundred years.

It was called Epiphany, from a Greek word meaning "manifestation," because it was believed that on January 6 the wise men made their visitation to Bethlehem.

The twelve days between Christmas and Epiphany were said to indicate the weather for the twelve months of the coming year, and the whole period from December 21 was observed with great solemnity, which burst forth at Epiphany into great hilarity.

The bean feast may have started in France or in Germany, and some say that it was a festival for the poor when employers gave bean soup to their workers. But the bean cake was the big Twelfth-Night idea in England and Scotland, and the royalty crowned at the feast were supposed to enact their assumed characters until midnight.


