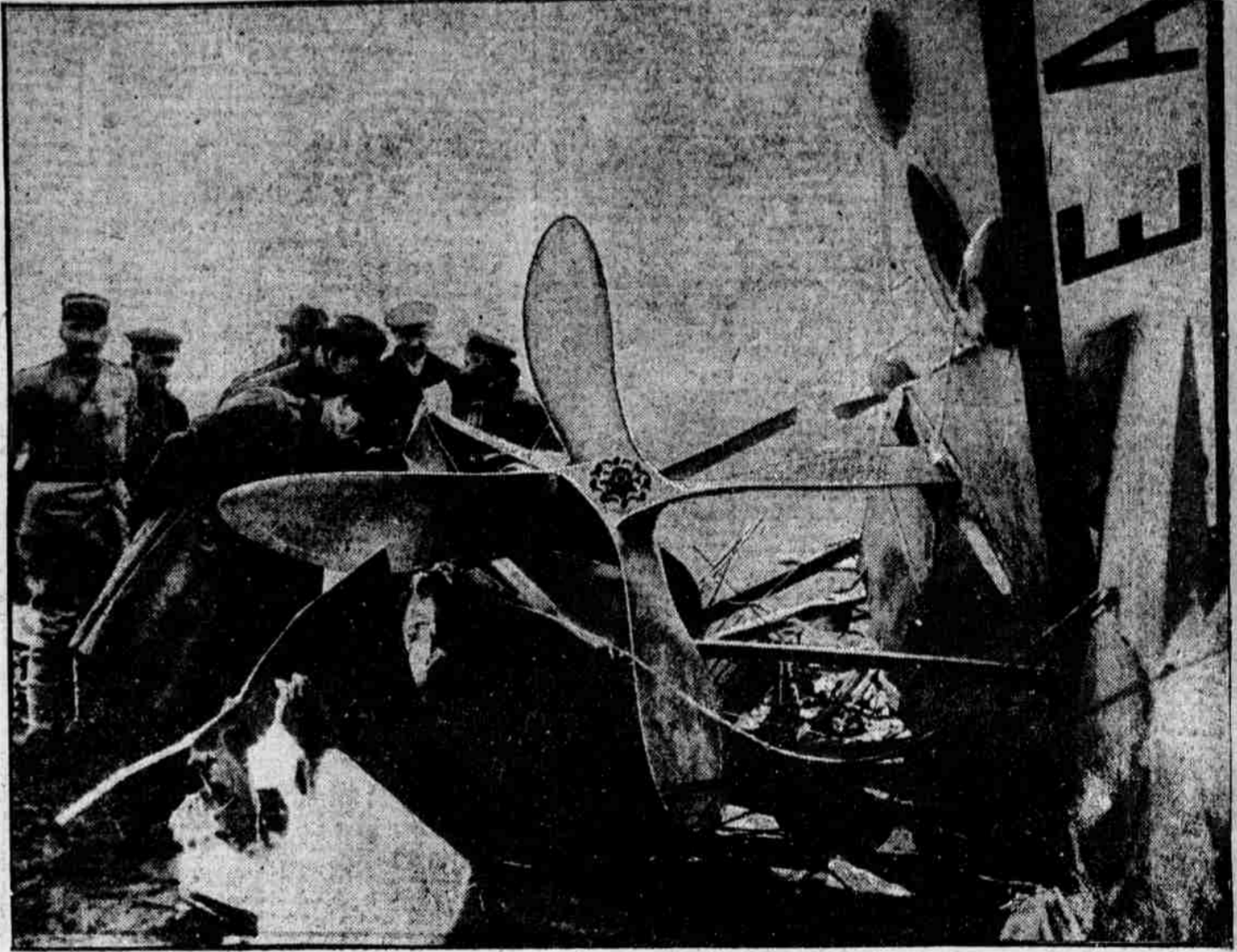
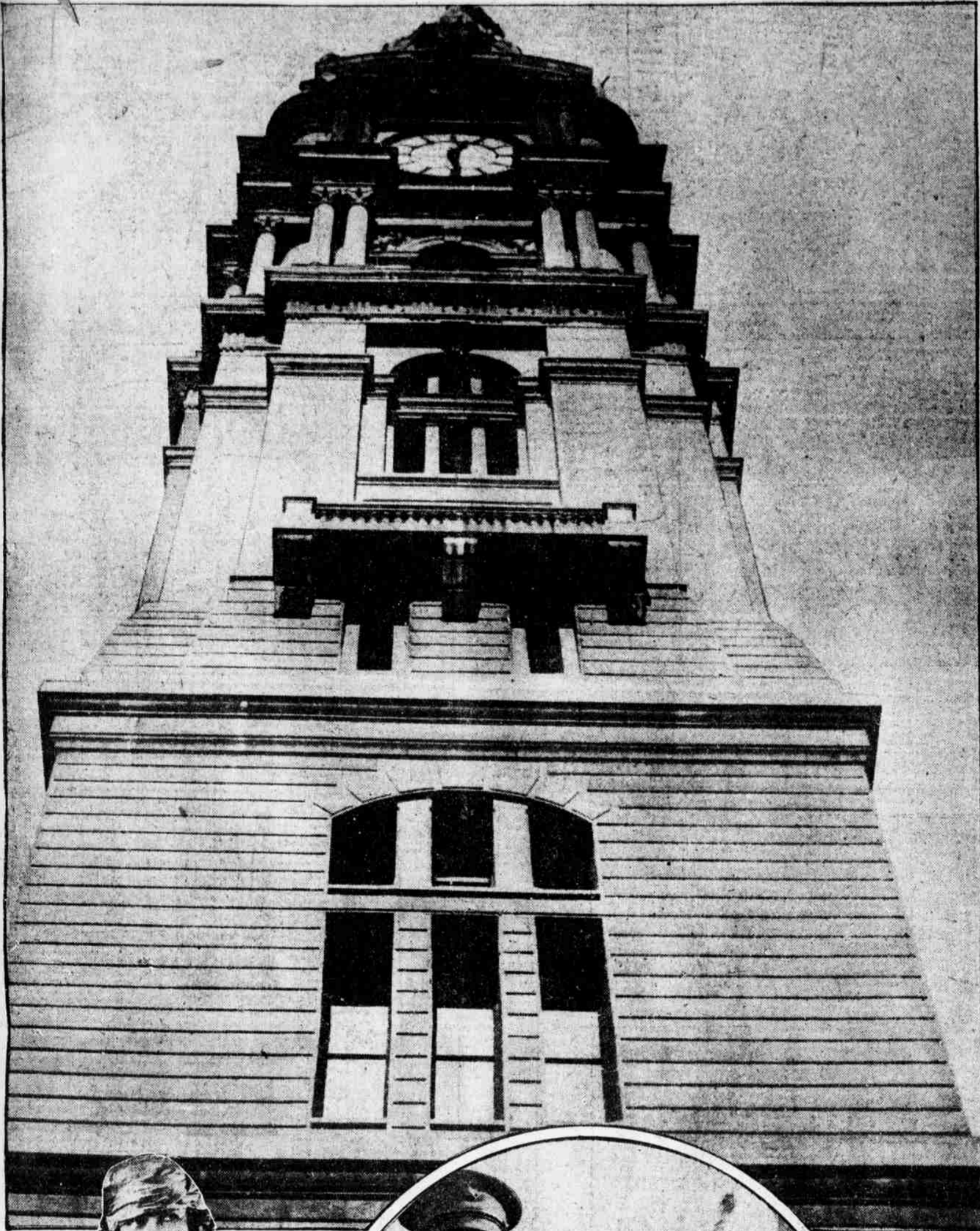
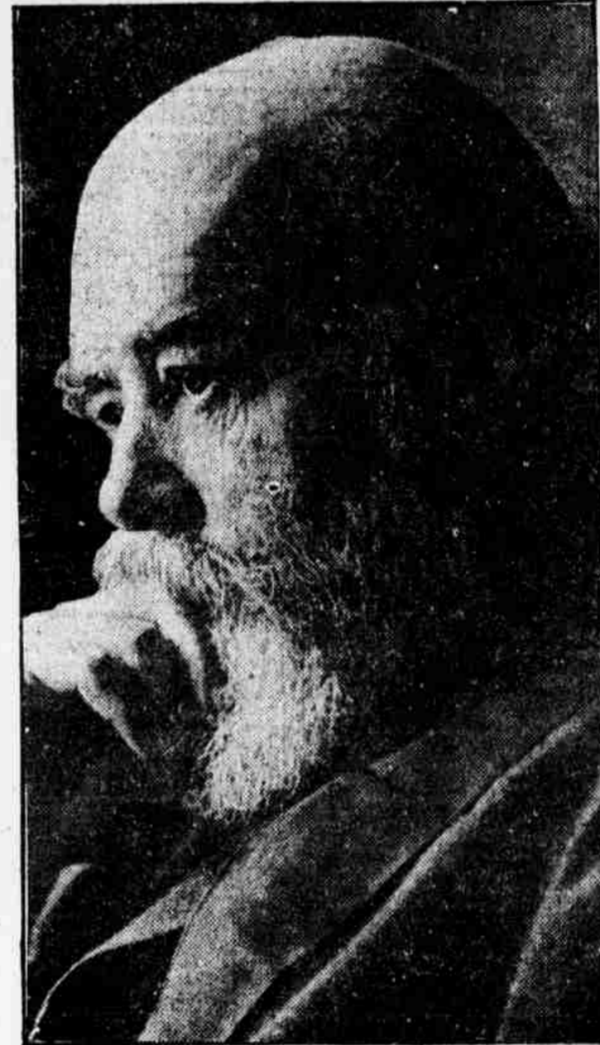


Askew Glimpse at City Hall Time : Alcock's Last Plane : Lion Pet : Won Promotion and Family
