CURB LIST DROPS TO LOWER LEVELS

Early Firmness Followed by Reaction Due to Break on Stock Exchange

INTEREST CENTERS IN OILS

New York, Feb. 9.—The curb market showed a moderately firm tone in the early trading, but around mid-day pressure was renewed and the entire list generally moved to lower levels following the further break in prices on the stock exchange.

The oils continued to attract most attention, some of these issues being in good demand during the morning, with the heaviest trading in Simms Petroleum, that stock moving up to 43 1/2.

General Asphalt dropped 4 points in the early trading to 94, and, after rallying to 97 1/2, sold off again. International Petroleum ranged in the first half of the day from 90 1/2 to 92 1/2.

NEW YORK COFFEE MARKET

New York, Feb. 9.—There was a decline of 12 to 25 points in coffee this morning, the greatest change being in the distant positions, which were relatively firm on Saturday and lost part of their premium during today's early trading.

The world's supply of coffee as of February 1 was 6,471,844 bags, which showed a decrease for the month of January of 485,874 bags.

The visible supply figures do not include 3,075,000 bags withdrawn from the stocks at Rio and Santos by the Brazilian Government.

Trading good on Paris Bourse Paris, Feb. 9.—Trading was good on the Bourse today. Three per cent rentes were quoted at 78 francs 53 centimes, exchange on London 48 francs 75 centimes.
