VERIFY KOLCHAK EXECUTION

By the Associated Press Constantinople, Feb. 13.—General Uhorevitch, twenty-eight-year-old Bol-shevik commander at Odessa, has threatened to open fire on the British warships there within three days if they

remain in the harbor, according to a message received here from Rear Admiral N. A. McCully, commanding United States naval forces in Russian

The message was sent after the admiral had conferred with the general, who expressed surprise that the British warships had fired on his troops.

General Uborevitch, the message reports, said he understood that the British had made a treaty with the Bolshevik government. He declared merchant ships would be welcome at Odessa for commercial purposes.

The general stated he had suppressed hooting immediately upon his arrival and had molested nobody but spies and thieves.

London, Feb. 13.—By A. P.)—News of the execution of Admiral Kolchak, former head of the All-Russian Government, has been officially confirmed. He and one of his ministers, Colonel Victor Pepelingey, were shot at Irkutsk at 5 o'clock on the morning of Feb-

ceuted. Members of the committee then shot the victims quickly, fearing attempts at rescue.

It has not been explained why the admiral and Colynel Pepellayev, who was premier and minister of the interior of the cabinet formed last November, were allowed to fall into the hands of the revolutionary committee.
