

H. B. ENDICOTT, SHOEMAKER, DEAD

Was Massachusetts Food Administrator and Managed Public Safety Committee

SETTLED LABOR DISPUTES

By the Associated Press Boston, Feb. 13.—Henry B. Endicott, wealthy shoe manufacturer, state food administrator and executive manager of the Massachusetts committee on public safety during the war, who was widely known as an arbitrator of labor disputes, died at a hospital in Brookline last night.

Mr. Endicott was considered one of the highest personal forces in the state during the war. His success in settling labor disputes was said to be unparalleled.

As a member of the firm of Endicott, Johnson & Co., he was one of the largest employers of labor in the country and was said never to have had a strike in his factories.

Mr. Endicott was born in Dedham and always maintained a residence in that town. He first entered the wool business in Boston and later became interested in leather.

As state food administrator and executive manager of the Massachusetts committee on public safety during the war, Mr. Endicott met with marked success.

CHINA LOOKS TO AMERICA FOR AID, SAYS DR. ANCELL

Woman Missionary Says Country Was Never More Open for Western Influences in Education and Christianity Than Now

"China never before was so open for western influences, of education and Christianity as she is today, and she looks to America more than any other nation to give it to her."

This statement was made today by Dr. Frances Capelle Ansell, wife of the Rev. Benjamin L. Ansell, D. D. Both are Episcopal missionaries to Yan Chow, China.

Doctor Ansell is a graduate of the Women's Medical College of this city and went to Soo Chow, China, more than twenty years ago to take charge of the hospital there under the direction of the Presbyterian Board of Missions.

The Rev. Dr. Ansell is now in charge of a parish and is a professor in the Admiral Mahan School at Yan Chow for boys. In connection with his school is a girls' school in which his wife does some teaching.

Dr. and Mrs. Ansell arrived in this country on a leave of absence for a year. They are guests of relatives at 3511 Locust street.

It has been their first trip home in seven years and they will return to Yan Chow in August of this year. "Most every one knows of the old superstitions which have hampered China's progress through the ages; but her faith and trust in America has been won by the missionaries who have worked there until now she respects and loves America and our people," said Dr. Frances Ansell, after explaining her husband's and her work among the Chinese.

"Another thing which makes her place her trust in us is that this country has never bartered for Chinese territory as most of the other nations have, and she is at last growing convinced that we wish to help her."

"The Chinese are most interesting people to work among and when made Christians they are splendid ones. It is only Christianity that will drive away the old ignorant customs. You know it is customary in China never to permit the man and woman contemplating marriage to see each other until the day the ceremony is actually performed. Today among the Christian boys and girls of our parish the boys and girls are permitted to see each other and become acquainted under the proper chaperonage. When they leave school

many of them exchange letters. So, you see, the light is gradually creeping through.

"Make as strong a plea as you possibly can for missionaries, for the opportune time is at hand. Never since the revolution in 1910 have there been more marvelous opportunities for the Christian men and women who would help their less fortunate brethren."
