

LEGION TO HEAR OF BONUS ACTION

State Commander Will Tell County Committees of Executive Body's Work

PLAN COMMUNITY HOUSE

George F. Tyler, commander of the Department of Pennsylvania, American Legion, will give the Philadelphia county committee and committees of all eastern counties of the state first-hand information as to the recent action of the national executive committee in recommending a \$50-a-dollar-a-month bonus for former service men.

The county committee meeting will be held in the City Club Wednesday evening, March 25. There will be an extended discussion of this question, as Pennsylvania voted against such a bonus at the national convention. In Philadelphia county, however, there has been a growing sentiment in favor of the bonus.

Congress' Attitude
The national convention presumed that Congress would work out the problem, but Congress requested the Legion to state definitely what is desired. In an effort to enroll a membership of 1000, Post No. 83, of the Forty-sixth ward, will hold a smoker tonight in Arcadia Hall, 5039 Baltimore avenue. This post will join with Post No. 399 in memorial exercises in the Fifty-sixth Street Theatre next Sunday. Certificates of the French Government to the next of kin will be presented to those living in this ward. Kensington Post No. 68 will hold a mass-meeting Thursday evening in the auditorium of Northeast Girls' High School, Amber and Cumberland streets, to launch the campaign for \$50,000 for a community house.

Quota Is Assured
"The members of the post are very enthusiastic," said J. E. McDonough, yesterday, "and from the way they are working it seems assured that the quota will be received."
Director of Public Welfare Ernest L. Mastin, Judge John M. Patterson, Colonel Clegg of the Frankford Arsenal; Franklin D'Olier, national commander of the Legion, and E. J. Cattell have been invited to speak.

A memorial choir stall has been presented to the Washington Chapel at Valley Forge by Mrs. William J. Eavenson, of 1504 Mount Vernon street. This was one of the four remaining memorial stalls still to be donated.
The choir stall will be a memorial to the late William J. Eavenson and in memory also of Captain Joseph Gibb, a Revolutionary officer, Mr. Eavenson's great-grandfather. Mr. Eavenson died in 1908. He was for years a vestryman of St. Jude's parish. M. B. Medary, Jr., is the designer of the new stall, which will be of oak. The carving will be by Edward Menece.
