Durable Dane Put Over Haymaker on Rossler Two Seconds After Gong Rang Starting First Round. Hawkins Credited With Speedy Knockout

Terry McGovern was a great one-round knockout artist, and the old-timers will tell you he stood alone in disposing of his opponents early...

His seventh and last one-round knockout was scored in Philadelphia on October 18, 1905, against Harlem Tommy Murphy...

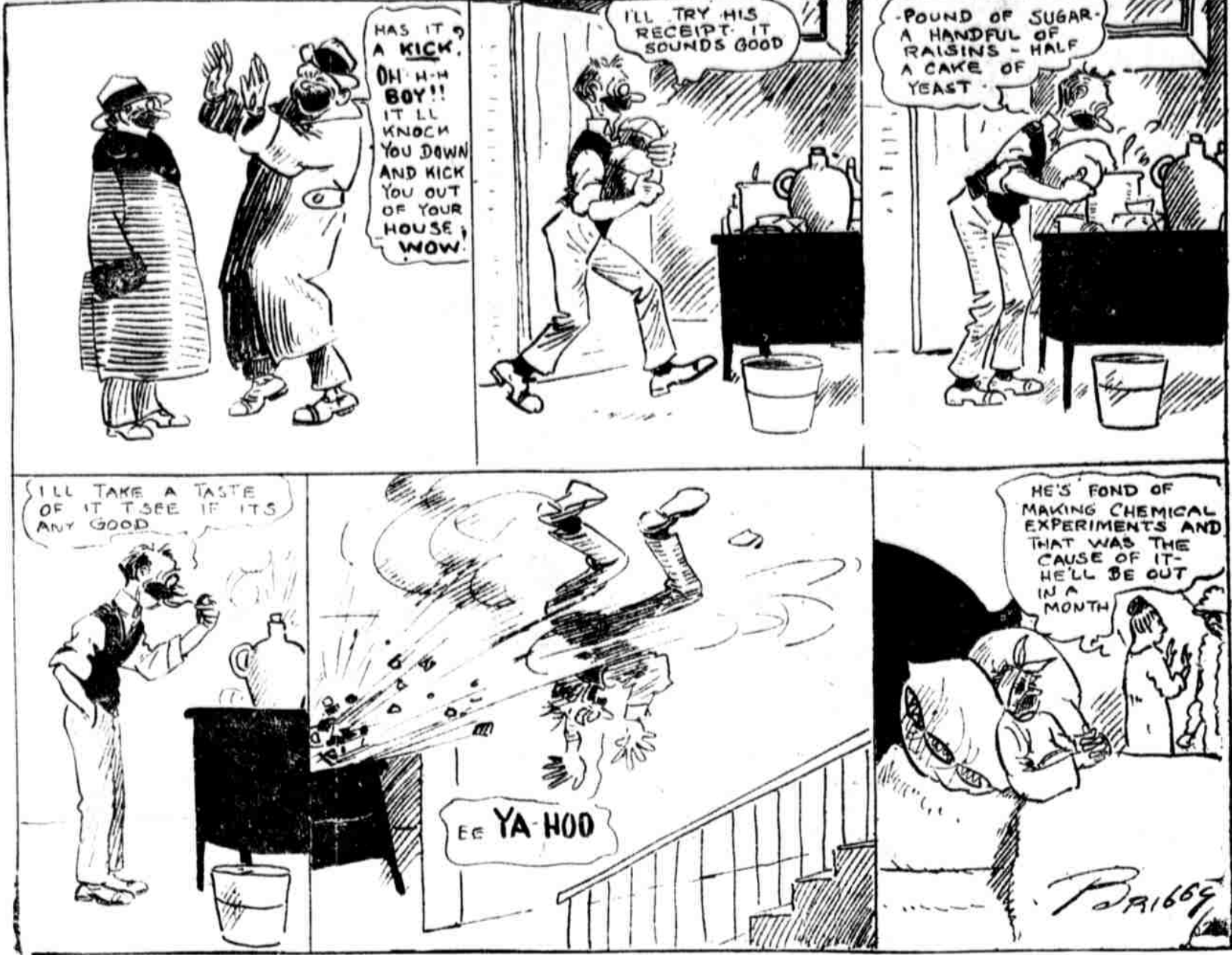
