

FEDERAL AGENT ARRESTED

Charged With Breaking Liquor Law During "Wet Revolt"
Grand Rapids, Mich., March 3.—(By A. P.)—George F. R. Cummerow, chief of the Grand Rapids office of the Department of Justice, who returned on Monday from the country, Mich., where he was at a special trial, before Justice of Myron H. Walker, United States district attorney, in connection with the "whisky robbery," was arrested at a hotel here last night by an agent of the Food and Drug Department on a charge of violating the liquor law.

Cummerow came to police headquarters and released himself, but failed to appear in police court today. He claimed the affair was a "frame-up." It is charged that Cummerow invited the agent into his room and gave him a drink of whisky.

P.)—More than 200 Republicans of Kentucky were in Louisville today attending the Republican state convention, which was called to elect four delegates and four alternates from the state at large to the Republican national convention in Chicago and to formulate plans for the Republican campaign in this state.

A. T. Hert, Republican national committee man from Kentucky, and Senator Edwin P. Morgan were said to be virtually assured of endorsement by the convention today as two of the four delegates from the state at large to the national convention. Some quarters appeared confident that Mrs. John Glover Smith, Frankfort, also would be endorsed by the convention, but it appeared probable that a fight on the convention floor for endorsement of fourth delegate would take place.

Will H. Hays, chairman of the Republican national committee, was a spectator at the convention.
