New York, March 3.—(By A. P.)—It became known last night that thieves had broken into a steel vault in a three-story building on Broadway, but side warehouse expecting to find placed there for safe keeping after having been brought from France. The gems had been removed by the owners, however, twenty-four hours before the arrival of the robbers who nevertheless carried away \$50,000 worth of merchandise.

Americans in Aintab Are Safe

Constantinople, March 3.—(By A. P.)—All Americans in Aintab, where disorders occurred early in February, were safe on February 14, according to a courier who has arrived here from Asia Minor. The situation is quiet, but Moslems refuse to sell supplies to Christians. French troops are not occupying Aintab, roads leading to which are infested by bandits.
