

CAMP DIX CHECKS DIPHTHERIA SPREAD

Three Germ Carriers Restored to Duty After Weeks of Isolation

23 OF 27 CASES CURED

The three "Diphtheria Dixes" of Camp Dix, who were responsible for the small epidemic of diphtheria in camp since January 5, have been returned to duty after isolation and treatment. When the disease first appeared in camp twenty-six cases were reported within the month following, the camp surgeon ordered throat cultures taken of the 1000 men in the units of which the twenty-six victims were members. According to Colonel T. L. Rhoades,

camp surgeon, three men were discovered who apparently in normal health were acting as carriers of the disease. They were isolated, their throats treated and given diphtheria antitoxin and later returned to duty as cured. Following their isolation only one case of diphtheria was reported. Of the twenty-seven cases in the camp of 6000 men, twenty-three have already returned to duty and four cases still under treatment are almost well. "There are disease carriers in every community," said Colonel Rhoades today, "and unless they are treated they might be as permanent spreaders of germs as was 'Typhoid Mary.' But in camp we discovered them at once, and we think our record is excellent in curbing the disease and successfully treating all cases."
