

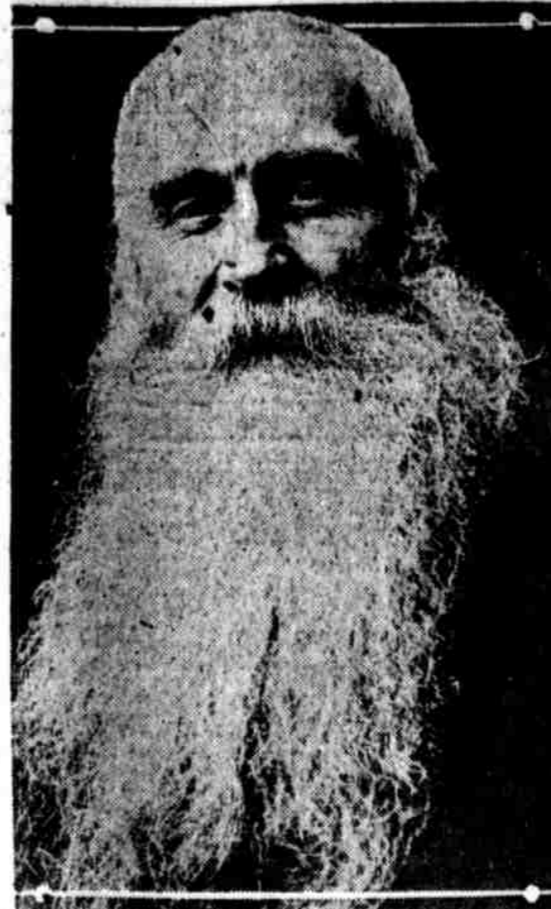
Bok Prize Winner Announced : Miss Astor a Fancy Skater : Taxicab Rescued From River



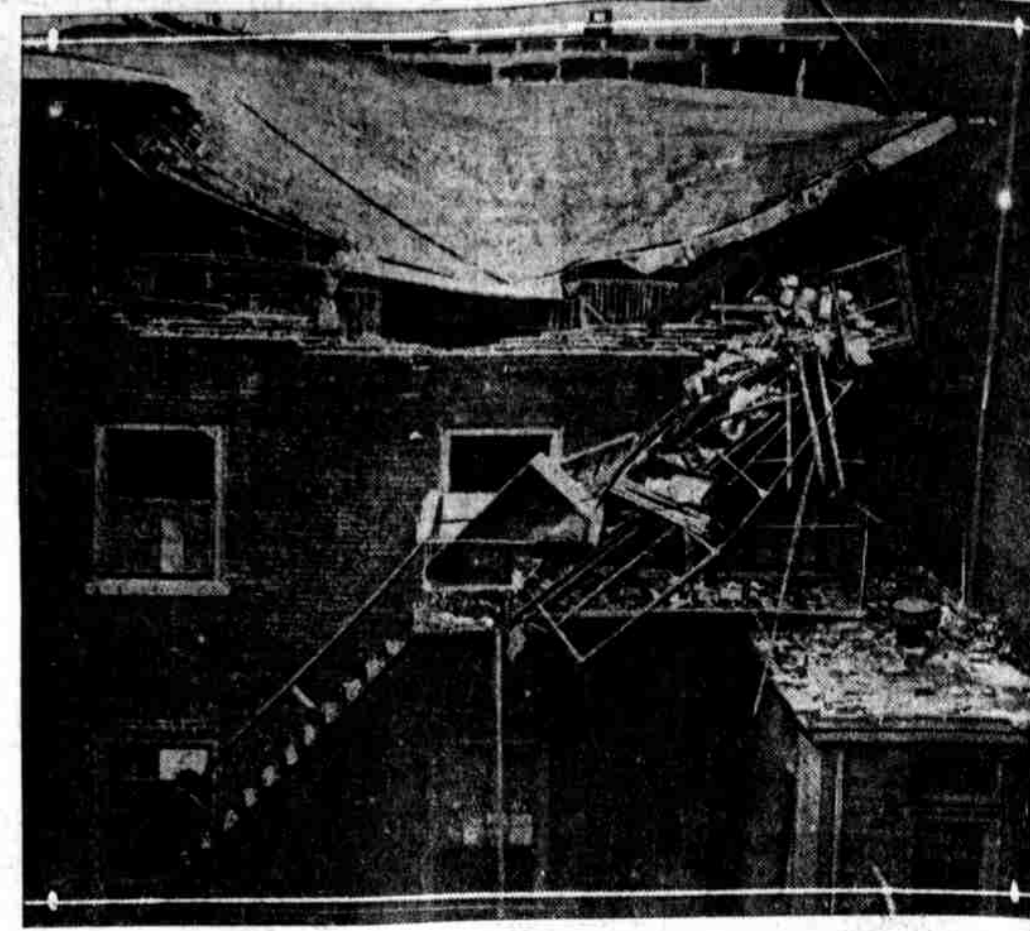

The fishing boats off Boston met much snow and rain during the recent days of storm. Hammer and ax were necessary to break the ice from the trawler Swell.

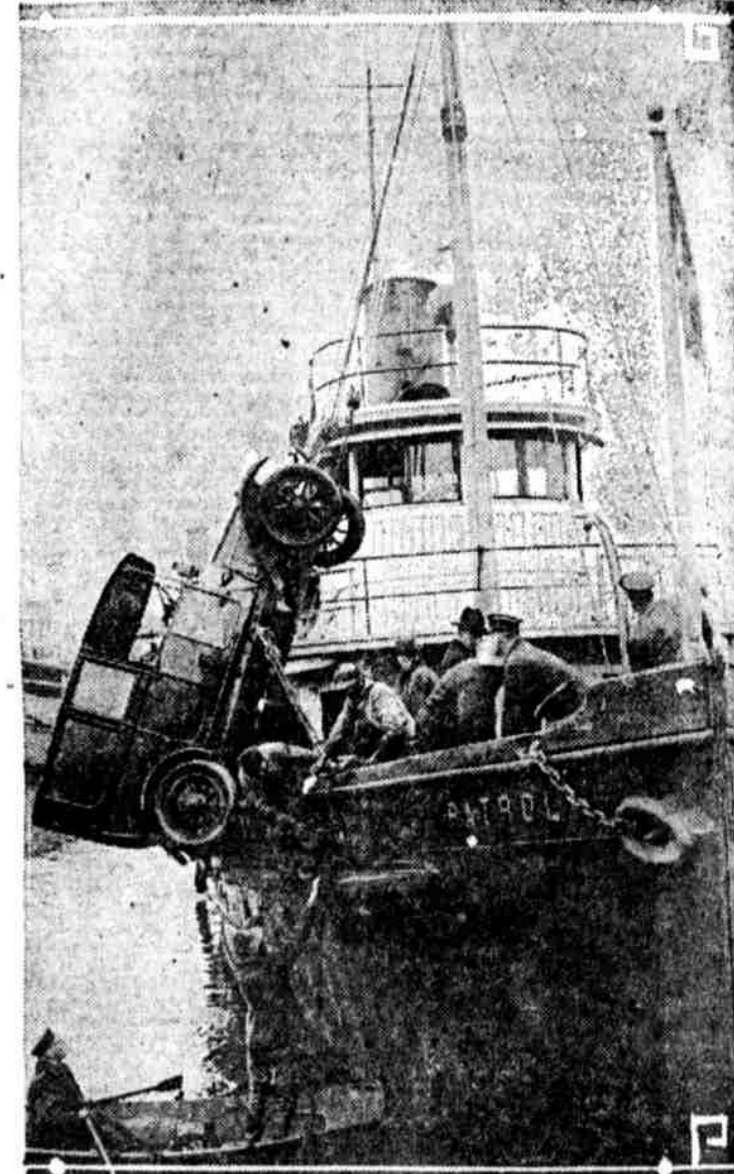

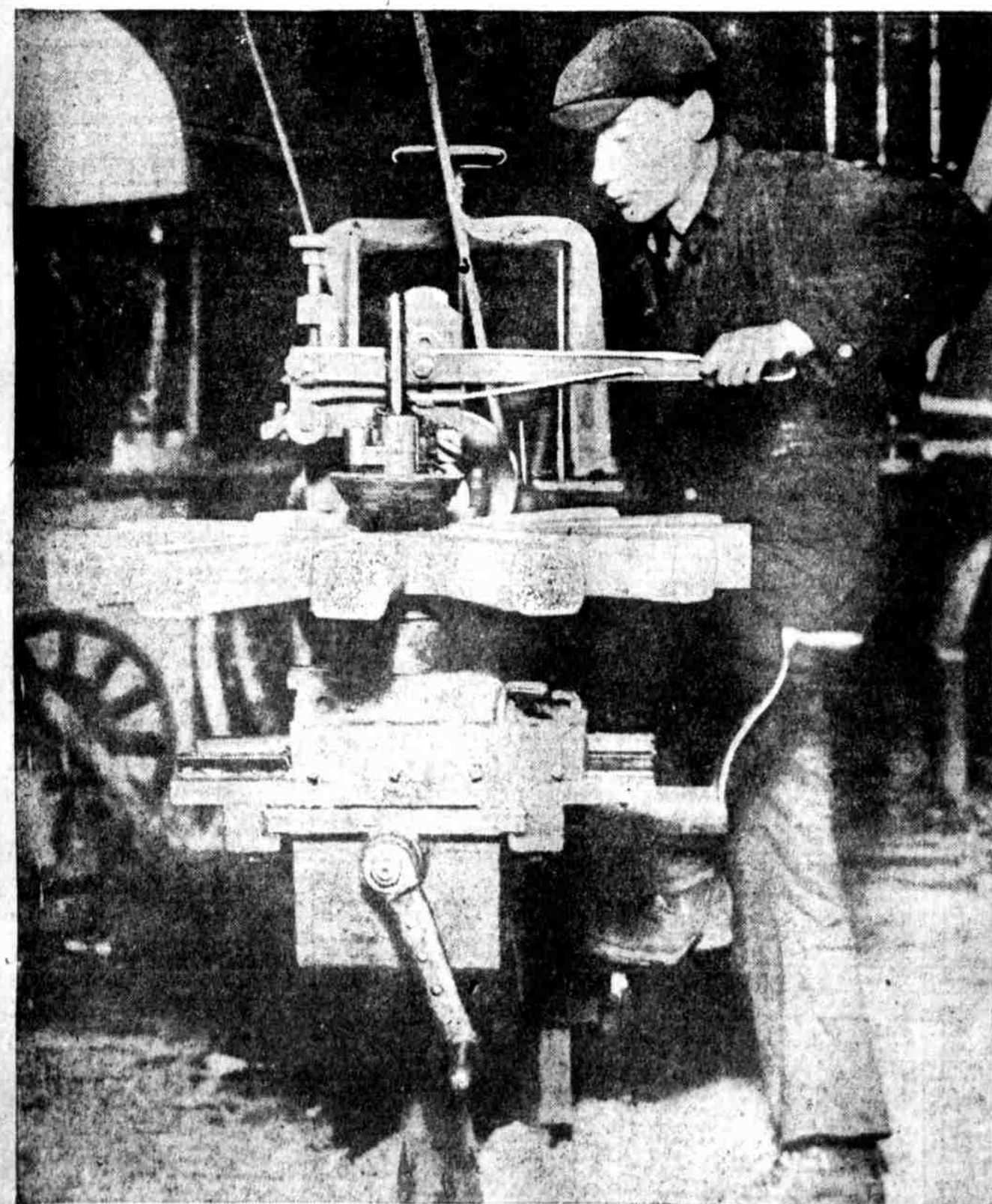


Underwood & Underwood. Roldal Amundsen, who discovered the South Pole, now preparing for a trip to the North Pole.



International. A taxicab being hauled out of the Hudson river at the mouth of Sherman creek, New York city. Damage to taxi was hardly noticeable.

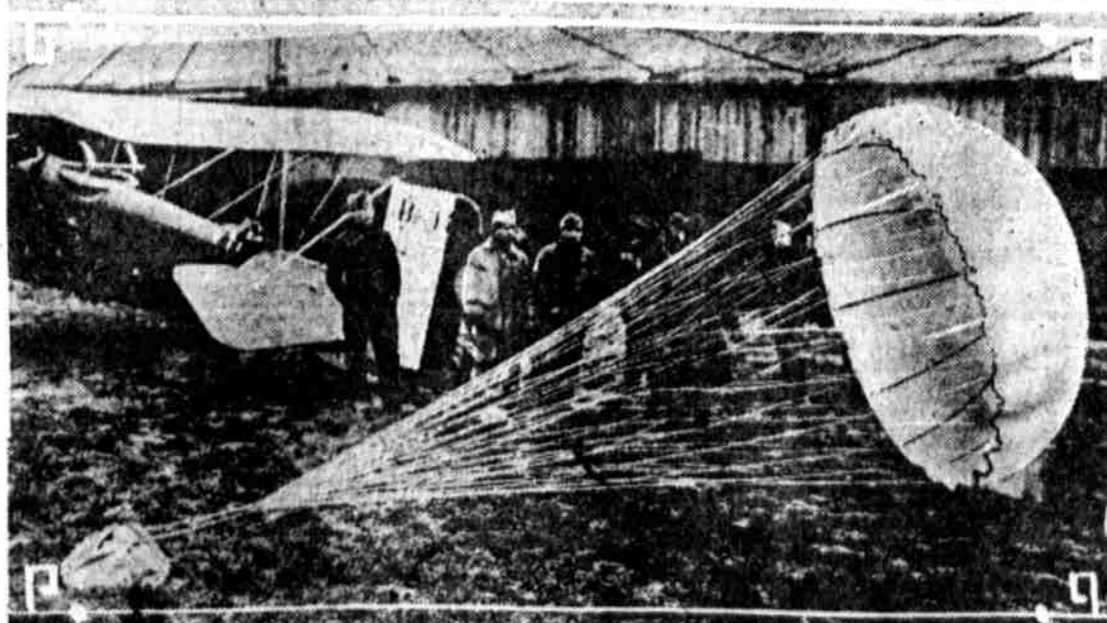
OUR CITY'S WORKERS AND WHAT THEY DO
