

## GIAMBIAMENTI NEL GABINETTO NITTI?

"Messaggero" di Roma Ritirone Necessario un Rimpasto Ministeriale

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Roma, 8 marzo.—Il giornale romano "Il Messaggero" nel portavoce ministeriale, in un odierno articolo fa presente che il Presidente del Consiglio, On. Nitti, proceda ad una ricostruzione del suo gabinetto prima della riapertura del Parlamento, allo scopo di rafforzario.

Si dice che l'On. Schanzer, Ministro di Tesoro, e l'On. Carlo Ferraris, Ministro per le Industrie, hanno posto il loro portafoglio a disposizione del Presidente del Consiglio, mentre due o tre altri ministri sarebbero disposti a dimettersi.

Se il gabinetto dovrà o no ricostruirsi sarà questione che dovrà essere discussa immediatamente in un Consiglio dei Ministri, dice il giornale. Ed aggiunge:

"La posizione personale dell'On. Nitti è stata notevolmente rafforzata dal successo che egli ha raggiunto in Londra, nonostante gli ingiusti commenti da parte della stampa francese. Si apprende che alcuni contingenti di truppe italiane sono in viaggio per Costantinopoli, insieme a reparti di truppe alleate. Sembra che colà la situazione sia diventata gravissima. La guarnigione alleata a Costantinopoli sarebbe stata elevata a 60,000 uomini."

Roma, 8 marzo.—Questa mattina è giunto in questa città, proveniente da Parigi, l'On. Nitti, accompagnato da vari funzionari. Poco dopo il suo arrivo il presidente del Consiglio dei Ministri si è recato da Re Vittorio con il quale ha avuto una lunga conferenza durante la quale ha spiegato tutta l'opera da lui svolta a Londra e Parigi. Il Sovrano a tratti ha colato l'On. Nitti.

Nel pomeriggio l'On. Nitti, ha ricevuto a palazzo Braschi l'Ambasciatore inglese e con lui è rimasto a colloquio per più di un'ora.

I giornali pubblicano un riassunto della ultima replica di Wilson ai Primi Ministri Alleati e rilevano che nella sostanza e nella forma essa costituisce una sfida alle volontà ed alla autorità delle Potenze Europee che tanto si affannano per ricondurre la pace in Europa.

In generale si ritiene che qualora una rottura definitiva tra il Presidente Wilson ed i Governi Alleati potrà essere evitata sulla questione Adriatica, non sarà possibile evitare quella nei riguardi di altri negoziati di altre importanti questioni, ossia la questione ottomana, quella della Russia e l'assetto definitivo delle colonie, salvo che il Presidente non cambi il suo atteggiamento.

## TOLL TO SUPPORT DELAWARE BRIDGE

New Jersey Commission Member Says Span Will Not Be Burden to Taxpayers

## SPROUL TO CALL MEETING

For the purpose of dispelling the illusion that the proposed Delaware bridge connecting Philadelphia and Camden would be a burden to taxpayers, Daniel F. Hendrickson, of Woodbury, N. J., and a member of the New Jersey bridge commission, today called attention to the fact that the structure would be a toll bridge.

Members of the New Jersey commission do not blame Mayor Moore, Governor Sproul and others for being cautious about the venture, he said, "but I regret that the people do not realize that the bridge will be a toll bridge and will, therefore, be self-supporting. It will be paid for by those who use it. I also regret that the bridge was not made a state project in Pennsylvania, as it was in New Jersey. Then there would be no necessity for awaiting a decision by the city of Philadelphia."

To expedite matters from the Pennsylvania side of the venture, it is probable that Governor Sproul will call a meeting of the members of the Pennsylvania bridge commission during the latter part of the week.

Commenting on Governor Sproul's views regarding steps to be taken to speed action on the bridge, Mayor Moore said last night:  
"I am very glad the Governor has made clear that there is no controversy between him and myself concerning the construction of the Delaware river bridge. It is fair that the City Council should get such information on the probable cost of the bridge as is in the Governor's possession before taking further action. The Governor and the Mayor are working harmoniously, and plans for work on the structure will be taken up as soon as possible."
