MORE FOREIGN PAY FOR SERVICE MEN

Soldiers Now Entitled to Increase on Entire Base Pay. Legion Issues Notice

TO PRESENT CERTIFICATES

According to a decision rendered by the comptroller of the treasury, which is the subject of a bulletin issued by the state headquarters of the American Legion yesterday, soldiers on foreign service, where 20 per cent increase is payable, are entitled to such increase on and after July 41, 1919, on their old base pay, which was authorized during the war.

The office of the director of finance is prepared to pay the claims arising under this decision. Discharged soldiers who returned to the United States after July 11, 1919, should make application to the director of finance, claims division. Munitions Building, Washington, D. RUDOLPH POLK IN RECITAL

American Violinist Makes Philadelphia Debut Successsfully


Rudolph Polk, an American violinist who gave up his studies in Europe to come home and enlist in the American army during the war, thus postponing his debut for three years, gave a successful recital at the Academy of Music last evening.

Mr. Polk chose for his principal num-

bers the G minor Sonata of Tartini and the third Concerto (B minor, or Saint-Saens. He also played two groups of smaller numbers and responded with several encores, making a very excellent impression upon his audience. His best feature is his tone, which is very powerful and clear and his technique, both, of the bow and of the left hand, is excellent, although he never forces it to the front at the expense of his interpretation.

While his tone is powerful, he pays comparatively little attention to the dynamics in his longer numbers and is inclined to play too much of one tone color and degree of strength. The concerto was well done and its technical difficulties, which are not small, were easily overcome. Nevertheless, he appeared to better advantage in the smaller numbers, several of which he was oxiged to repeat, so enthusiastic was the applause. He is conscientious and evidently gave his best all the time. With the maturity of style and of musical thought which only the years and experience can give, he should years and experience can give, he should make a name for himself on the American concert platform.




