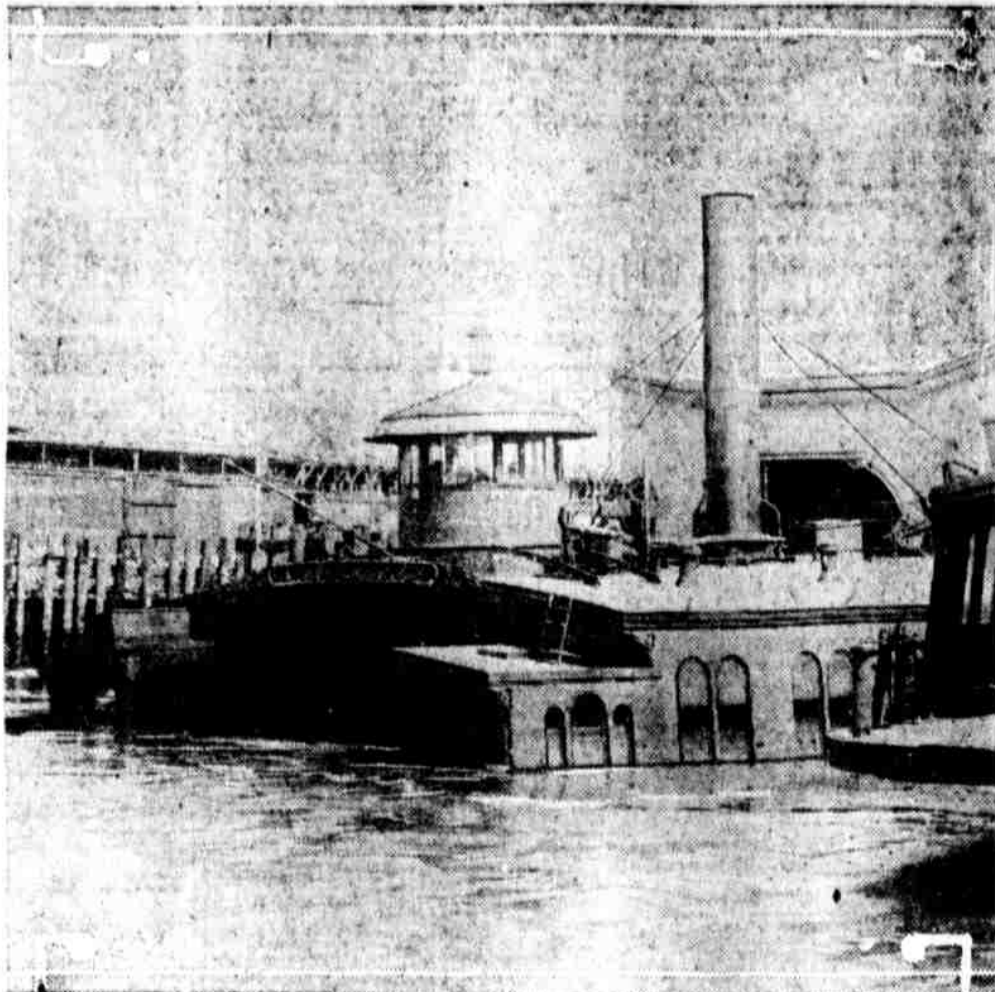


Ferryboats Stalled by Ice : Protecting Animals for 30 Years : Breaking Irish Horses

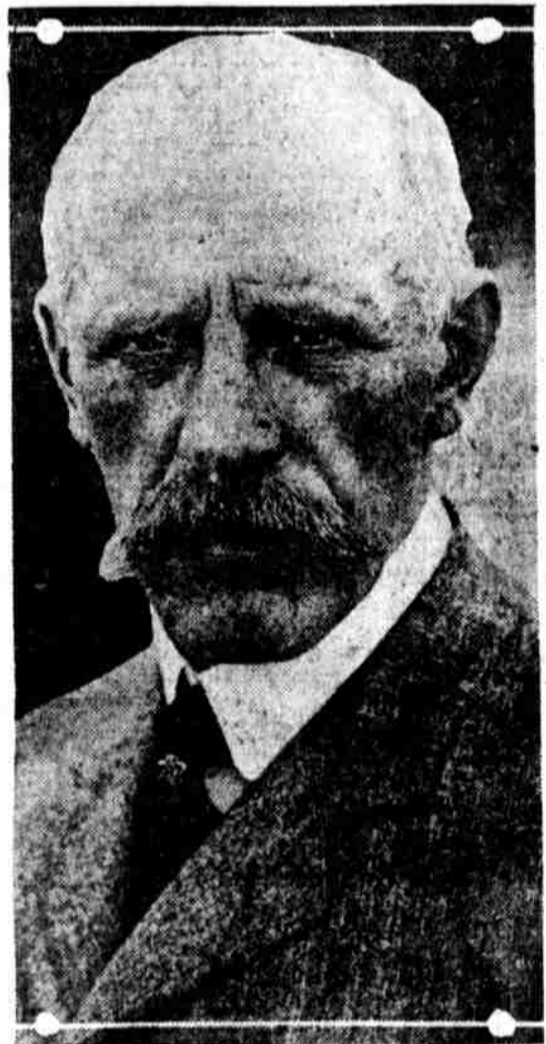
THE PENNSYLVANIA, a ferryboat of the Pennsylvania ferries, resting on the bottom of the Delaware in the slip on the Camden side.

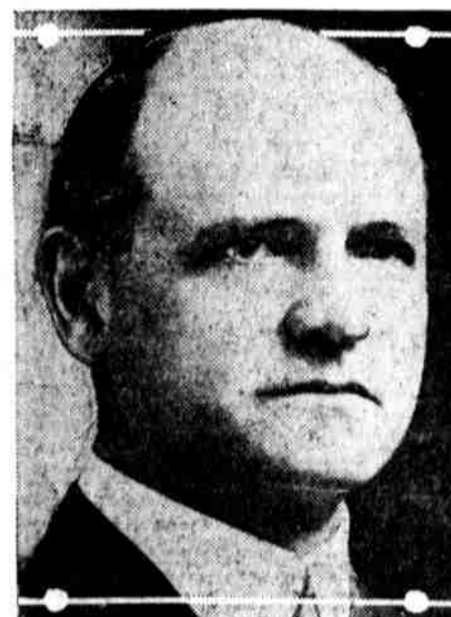
DOING A LOT of thinking these days. The war ending did not leave him idle. He is Ferdinand Foch, who headed the allied armies.

MRS. CARRIE YOST, 2111 North Woodstock street, is operating a double-needle sewing machine in the shirt manufacturing plant of L. Needles-Brooker Co., Tenth and Berks streets. She is piecing sleeves at the rate of 100 dozen a day. Note the cotton coming down to the machine from the four cones above, feeding the double needles, which sew the two lines of stitches at the one operation.
