Former service men from Philadelphia and vicinity who were in the Tank Corps will meet tonight in the Chamber of Commerce Assembly Hall, Widener Building, Philadelphia, to organize and decide whether to join the American Legion as a body.

The Charles E. Kelly Post No. 112, of Meyersdale, Pa., has ratified the suggestion of the national executive committee that former service men be compensated with a \$50 bond for each month of service.

Permanent charters will soon be issued to the posts, and the state headquarters has indicated a desire that posts adopt permanent names at once.

"IL TROVATORE" SUNG

Zanelli and Matzenauer Star in the Cast With Crimi and Muzio

Opera in four acts, by Giuseppe Verdi

Last evening's performance of "Il Trovatore" by the Metropolitan Opera Co. was greeted by a house crowded to the doors and the immense audience heard a good, but not especially inspired rendition of the work whose beauty of melody makes it live season after season, in spite of the absurdity and incongruity of the plot and the palpable weakness of the libretto and, in places, of the orchestration.

Interest in the performance centered largely in the first appearance in a really important role of the Chilean baritone, Renato Zanelli, who sang the part of the Count. Mr. Zanelli has a fine voice, which is at its best in the upper register, and he covered the field of the evening by his singing of the broad and beautifully sustained aria, "Il balen del mio," in the second act.

Miss Muzio as Leonora sang finely and met the impossible dramatic requirements of the part as well as the appearance of the audience she did especially well. Mr. Crimi made a satisfactory Marullo vocally, but was not so heroic in the part as some tenors have been hit with. Lyric work and not

heroic parts are Mr. Crimi's forte. The lesser parts, taken by Miss Egner and Messrs. Martino, Audisio and Reschiglian, were excellent. Mr. Papi in his conducting allowed a little too much tone in the orchestral accompaniment of the "Miserere," but otherwise read the opera with an excellent sense of values, although some of the choral numbers were a bit wobbly.

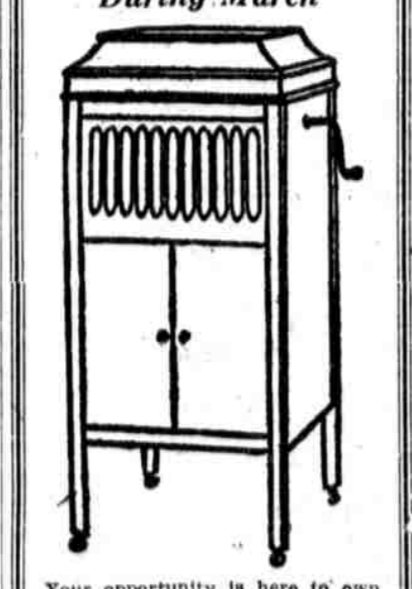
