

# HOLLAND CLOSELY GUARDS EX-KAISER

Wilhelm's Castle Resembles an Old Prison Fortress Since German Coup

## FORMER RULER IS NERVOUS

Amersfoort, March 18.—The enforcement of the Dutch guard at Van Buren castle, which since the Middle Ages has been protected by moats and drawbridges, has made the former German emperor's refuge a veritable prison fortress, capable of defense even in the unexpected event of an attack by raiders desiring to free the exile. Constabulary and military police patrol the roads with loaded rifles night and day. The guards are not permitted to cut down their rifles for a minute. When motorcars occupied by members of the Bentinck family or their employees desire to leave the castle they are halted at the gate and searched by police inspectors.

## CONSTANTINOPLE QUIET

Forces From Allies' Fleet in Bosphorus Keep Order  
Constantinople, March 17.—(By A. P.)—The second day of the inter-allied occupation of Constantinople, carried out on Tuesday by large forces from the imposing war fleet in the Bosphorus, passed with entire calm. The Turkish police co-operating in keeping order.

The French and the Italians had only small forces here, and they are far less active than the British troops, which are excellently organized.

Among the prisoners taken were Easud Pasha, nationalist leader, and Mohammed Pasha, who was minister of war just before the great war, opened.

Washington, March 18.—Allied military occupation of Constantinople was forced upon the Allies by the growing power of Mustafa Kemal over the sultan's government, the only element of authority in Turkey favorable to acceptance of allied peace terms, according to officials here.

The maneuver was not regarded, however, as an attempt at permanent settlement, but rather as in line with the plan of Turkish adjustment drawn up in London by the ambassadors' conference.

# BOLIVIA REGRETS AFFRONT TO PERU

President Guerra's Aide Presents Official Apology for Attack on Legation at La Paz

## NEW CABINET IS FORMED

Lima, Peru, March 18.—The aide-camp of President Guerra, of Bolivia, called at the Peruvian legation at La Paz yesterday and expressed the Bolivian Government's regrets for the attack on the legation last Sunday night, according to official advice received here today.

After the receipt of this information Foreign Minister Porras forwarded a note to La Paz asking for material reparation for the loss incurred and the arrest of officials involved in the demonstration.

Detailed reports of the incident indicate that many Peruvian commercial houses were looted during the disorder at La Paz and confirmation has been received of the report that the office of the newspaper La Razon was destroyed. A crack Bolivian cavalry regiment which was sent to Guaquil, near the frontier, has been withdrawn to La Paz, which city is apparently under martial law.

A small crowd attacked the Bolivian mission here today, but was driven off by the troops on guard before any damage was done. The prefect of Lima immediately called at the legation and expressed regrets for the incident.

La Paz, Bolivia, March 15.—A new cabinet has been formed by President Juan Gutierrez Guerra, the portfolio of foreign relations being retained by Carlos Gutierrez. The other members of the cabinet follow: Government and justice, Ercasto Cargu; finance, Julio Zamora; war and colonization, General Prudencio; public instruction and agriculture, Guillermo Anes; industry and public works, Cesar Ochave.

London, March 18.—Fifteen thousand engineers employed by the office of works struck yesterday, but a settlement was reached last night. One hundred and twenty of them were in the houses of Parliament. The strike was the result of a refusal to discharge foremen who had dismissed a man who later was reinstated.
