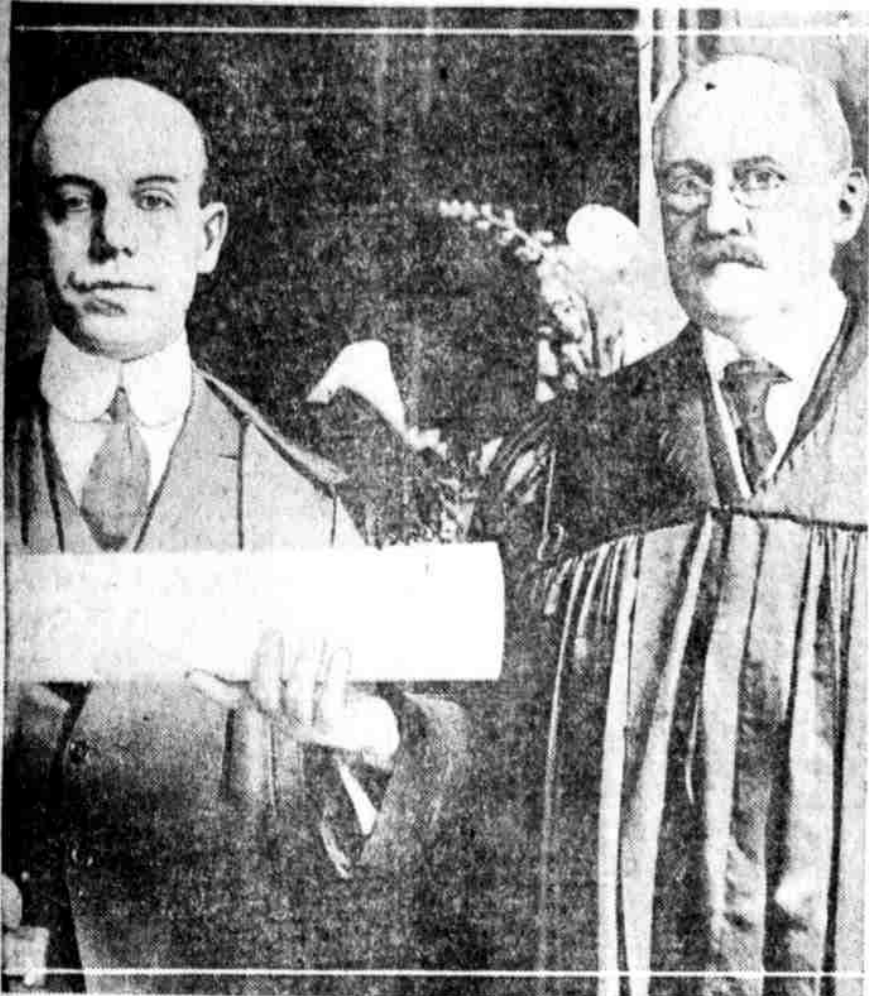


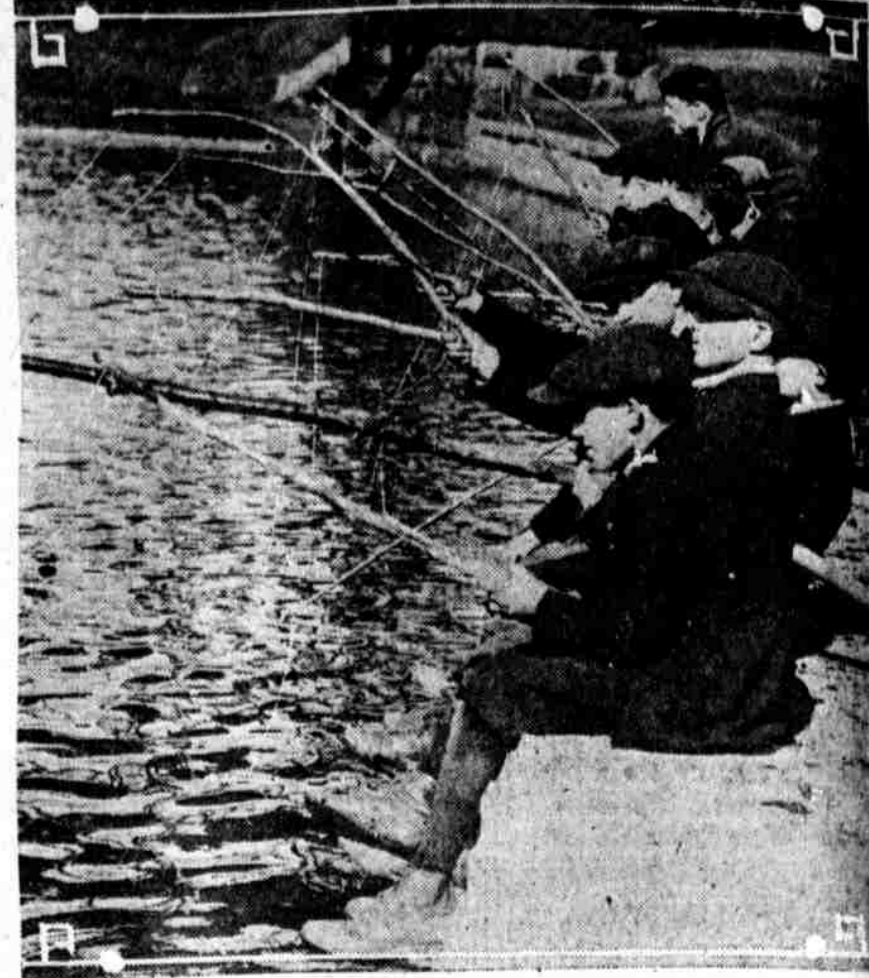
Touches of Spring Attend Beautiful Sunday : Delaware Suffrage Supporters Ready for Fight

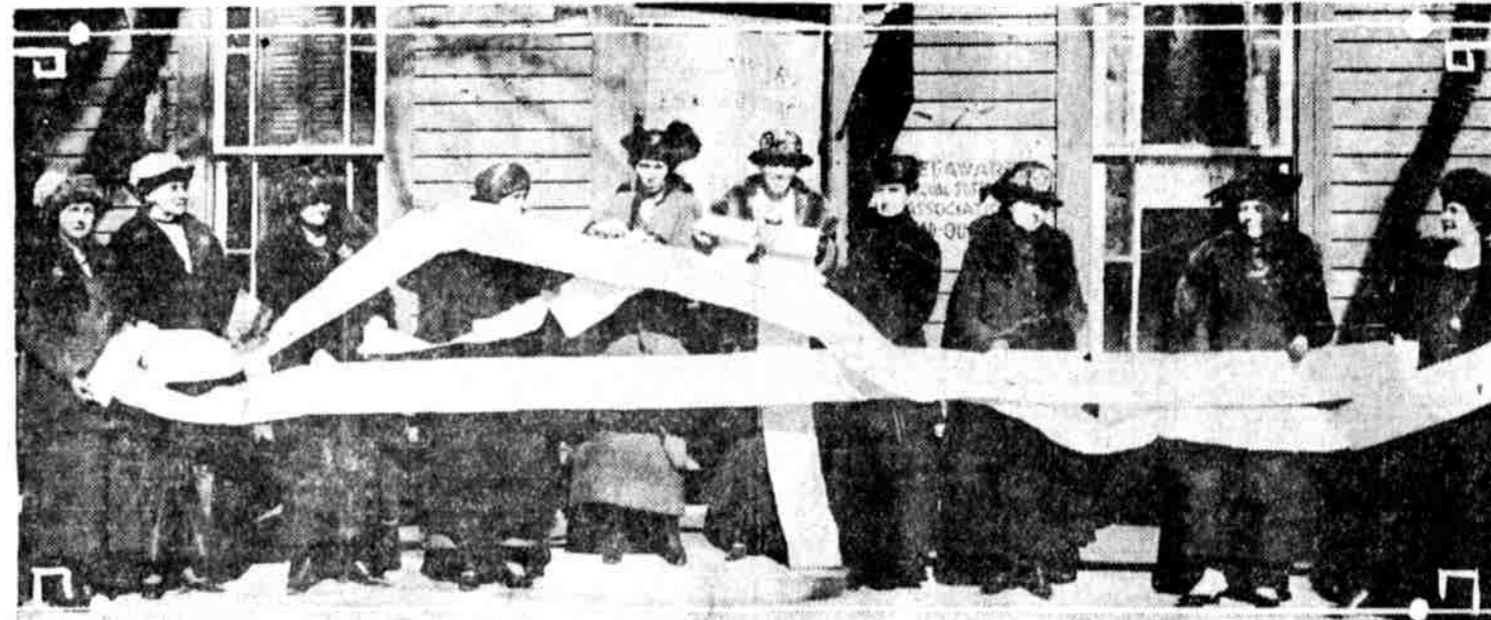

THEY SAID they were the Franklin street "hoboes" and were out for a lot of fresh air and good sun. Their catch from the Schuylkill is not worth mentioning.

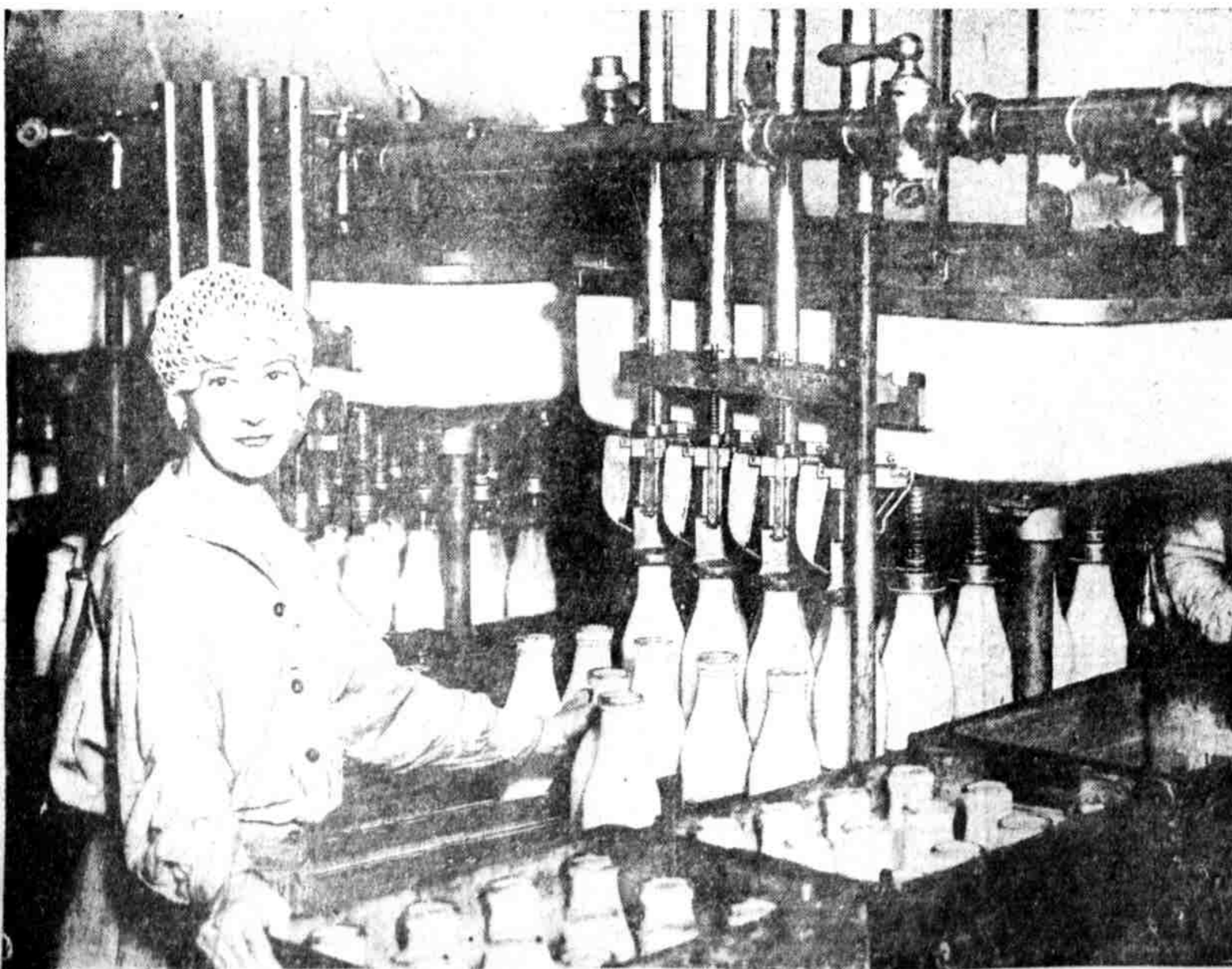
