NO SUFFRAGE AID FROM CONNECTICUT

Governor Refuses to Call Legislature Despite Action of G. O. P. Convention

DELEGATES ARE NAMED

Hartford, March 25 .- Governor Mar-Hartford, March 25.—Governor Marcus H. Holcomb. Republican, in a
statement last night, fiatly refused to
call a special session of the Connecticut
General Assembly to act on the proposed federal suffrage amendment. The
Republican state convention, by an almost unanimous vote, called on the
governor to convoke such a session, so
Connecticut might be the thirty-sixth onnecticut might be the thirty-sixth State to ratify.
Governor Holcomb's statement fol-

lows:

"I have read the resolution passed today by the Republican state convention. I do not see how that changes the situation or assists to create the special emergency which authorizes the governor to call a special session.

"The state constitution places the remainder of the remainder of the remainder. I shall sponsibility upon the governor. I shall not shift it to the delegates to the Re-

not shift it to the delegates to the Republican state convention. I again decline to call a special session.

"The adoption by thirty-six states of the federal suffrage amendment will change our constitution, but until it is changed my oath of office requires me to support it in its unaltered form.

"If Connecticut should be one of the thirty-six states to adopt the suffrage amendment by the vote of the General Assembly, and thereby change our constitution without the concurring vote of the electors of the state, it would be contrary to the provisions of our constitution."

New Haven, March 25. — With scarcely a dissenting voice, the Republican state convention adopted a resolican state convention adopted a resolution placing the party in Connecticut on record in favor of equal suffrage, and requesting Governor Holcomb to call a special session of the General Assembly to ratify the proposed federal amendment.

A preamble to the resolution expressed the belief of the committee that, as un-certainty exists as to ratification by one additional state in time to permit women to vote in the presidential election, a "special emergency" is created that would warrant the governor's calling the
