

GRAVI DISORDINI IN PIU' PARTI D'ITALIA

Il Governo Determinato a Reprimere i Disordini Istigati da Agitatori Socialisti

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Roma, 26 marzo.—Energie provvidenti, allo scopo di controllare il movimento per gli scioperi attraverso l'Italia, sono stati presi dal Governo e dai rappresentanti di parecchie provincie, che qui si riuniscono ieri, per indirizzare un appello al Parlamento raccomandando che immediati passi siano fatti contro gli agitatori socialisti. A Firenze la situazione sembra sia per diventare grave.

Gravi agitazioni tra gli operai di importanti stabilimenti in parecchie città d'Italia sono state segnalate dai Prefetti. C'è il disordine e l'occupazione da parte degli operai delle fonderie

di Miani e Silvestri in Napoli, dopo che gli operai avevano barricate tutte le entrate, la truppa circondò gli stabilimenti e fece uso delle mitragliatrici per costringere i rivoltosi alla resa. Parecchie migliaia di operai di altre fabbriche ed officine, abbandonarono il lavoro per solidarietà dei compagni delle predette fonderie.

Disordini sono anche rapportati per un gigantesco sciopero che comprende 300.000 contadini nelle provincie di Novara, Alessandria, Brescia e Treviso. A Torre Annunziata, presso Napoli, i magazzini governativi furono danneggiati da bombe fatte esplodere dai dimostranti. Durante una dimostrazione innanzi al palazzo municipale di Catania il Comm. Blandania, sindaco della città, fu assassinato, mentre tentava di pacificare i rivoltosi.

Roma, 25 marzo.—Alla Camera dei Deputati, oggi, i socialisti attaccarono violentemente la politica del Governo. Il deputato Graziadei, socialista, annunciò che il debito pubblico ammontava a 100 miliardi. Attacchi furono anche fatti per la politica riguardo la questione di Fiume.

Il Presidente della Camera, On. Orlando, annunciò che l'On. Rossi era stato eletto vice presidente al posto dell'On. Alessio, nominato ministro per le poste e telegrafi.

Fu presentata una interrogazione relativa ai disordini di Napoli e Brescia e rimasero uccisi tre operai. L'On. Nitti dichiarò che il Governo non era ancora in grado di rispondere perché attendeva informazioni al riguardo, ma che era suo dovere far man-

tenere l'ordine. A tale risposta i socialisti insorsero, gridando: "Il vostro dovere è quello di difendere i pesci grossi e gli speculatori!"

SLAIN DEFENDING WOMAN

American Missionary in China Victim of Robbers

Pekin, March 26.—The death of J. R. Menzies, a Presbyterian missionary of Toronto, who was killed by robbers at Hwaikangfu (Hunan province) occurred while he was defending the women's quarters in the mission from an attack by a large band.

Mr. Menzies, answering calls for help, grappled with one of the robbers, whereupon the others fired a volley, killing the missionary and the robber.

LETTS EVACUATE BORDER

Agreement Reached With Esthonia Over Disputed Districts

London, March 26.—The Lettish legation announces as a result of a conference held at Walk, Livonia, between representatives of Letyia and Esthonia concerning the border question, an agreement was signed, subject to ratification within two weeks, under which Esthonia will evacuate the occupied districts, leaving them under control of the commanders-in-chief of both states. The question concerning the ownership of the districts is to be submitted to arbitration.

The legation also says that the Lettish foreign minister has announced

his government intends to notify M. Tchitcherin, the Bolshevik foreign minister in Russia, that Letyia is prepared to start peace negotiations with the Moscow government after Easter.
