CLOSING MARKET VERY IRREGULAR

Opening Advance Met a General Profit-Taking Movement in Recent Favorites

New York, March 27.—The evening up operations of the professional traders incidental to the week-end proved considerable irregularity in price movement in today's stock market.

Some surprise was expressed in the slowing down of the market, more especially in view of the sharp drop in the call loan rate yesterday, but for some extent the pools and speculative combinations showed no disposition to resume active operations.

The motors and their specialties continued prominent features in the initial trading, but the market was not strong.

Active trading in speculative shares was resumed on a broader scale this week, the movement continuing to extend into the latter part of the first hour.

The week's trading was unusually flat and in some quarters disappointment was expressed in the failure of the market to respond to buoyant forecasts.
